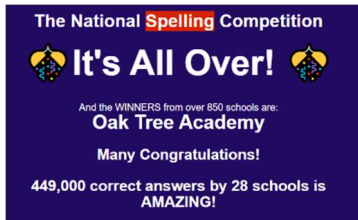

This week we enjoyed Science Week in school. As part of this, the children took part in live streamed events from a farm in Wales, watching as vets carried out their work during lambing and calving season. This linked so well to the careers event that took place last week as well. Thank you to the PTA for agreeing to fund our whole school Zoo Lab workshops as well. Financial Help

Free Money for Childcare and After-School Clubs and Holiday Camps

It is a really difficult time at the moment with bills, rent and food prices all soaring. At The William Hogarth School, we are continually looking at ways to help out our community and try to alleviate some of the pressures families are facing.

Tax -Free Childcare which is a government scheme to help working families with the costs of childcare is something that could help you with current costs. It is not only for 15/30 hours free childcare for nursery aged children (if entitled) but also includes wrap around provision such as **breakfast and after-school care** as well as **after-school clubs** for children up to the age of 11.

Tax-Free Childcare is a bank account that is set up in your child's name and for every £8 you put in, the government will top up with another £2 - up to a maximum of £2000 a year. You must pay out to an organisation that is Ofsted registered - (schools and lots of sports clubs are) and then you pay for your provision through the scheme. If you earn under £100,000, it is likely that you are eligible to claim.

Check out the other eligibility criteria and sign up at <https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare> - it's very easy! This can therefore be used towards our after school clubs and with Let's Leap breakfast and after school care provision.

Dear Parents

As we are all aware, school budgets are stretched and we are always looking for ways to increase our resources in our school so that we can provide the best possible educational experience for your child. This may include trips and clubs.

One of the easy ways you can help us, every family, is to check if you are eligible for Free School Meals by accessing this link: https://www.hounslow.gov.uk/info/20025/schools_and_colleges/61/free_school_meals

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Please note that part of school funding is based on how many families receive free school meals. If we can increase the numbers, we increase our funding eligibility. Simple!!!

HAF – Holiday Activity Food Programme

Families with children living in the borough who are aged between 5 and 16 years and entitled to benefit related free school meals, can attend the Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF) activities for free. When families are registered for benefits related free school meals, they will automatically receive their voucher/s to book (pictured).

Funded by Department for Education, HAF in Easter will be delivered by experienced providers with fun and enriching activities featuring sports and games, cooking, computing coding, music, arts and crafts, circus skills and so much more taking place across the borough. Children can take part in some activities for the celebration of the Easter, Ramadan and Eid. Eligible children can attend four sessions from 2 to 12 April and enjoy a free, nutritious meal every day. Children who are fasting for Ramadan are encouraged to come along and each provision will be able to adapt to the child's needs.

Lampton Leisure expands HAF programme to all Hounslow leisure centres

Following the success of Lampton Leisure's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme at Brentford Fountain Leisure Centre and Hanworth Air Park Leisure Centre over the past two years, the holiday camp offer is being expanded to all Hounslow leisure centres. The extension of the HAF programme forms part of Lampton Leisure's ongoing commitment to offer the local community improved access to health and wellbeing services.

Lampton Leisure's HAF sessions provide eligible children with access to free and engaging activities including swimming, tennis, dodgeball and fun team challenges such as 'drop the egg'. Sessions last four hours each and attending children also receive a healthy meal.

Lampton Leisure has run 14 weeks worth of HAF sessions since first launching the programme in April 2022 and last year the business was selected as a regular HAF provider. Welcoming 66 participants in its first camp, Lampton Leisure's holiday programmes have grown rapidly with 126 participants attending the sessions over the Christmas holidays. By extending the HAF programme to all six of its leisure centres, Lampton Leisure will improve access to sessions for children across the borough.

Parents of children who have attended previous Lampton Leisure holiday camps have shared overwhelmingly positive feedback about the programme. One said: "Everyone is friendly and I can see a big change in my daughter's confidence and motivation in sports and socially. I really appreciate the coaches and can't wait to bring my daughter back."

Rowland Omamor, Managing Director of, Lampton Leisure, said: "By expanding our HAF programme to all six of our sites, we are helping more children in Hounslow to stay active and develop new skills in line with our commitment to deliver better health and wellbeing outcomes for the community. With a broad range of fun and confidence-building sessions and nutritious meals on offer, we are supporting healthier lifestyles while providing children with the opportunity to participate in activities that they may not otherwise have access to."

Parents in receipt of a qualifying benefit are encouraged to apply for HAF for their children attending reception to year 11 who receive benefit-related free school meals. All claims should be verified by the school or local authority.

New Football for Women in Chiswick. No Experience necessary. MONDAY evenings 7.30-8.30pm.

Chiswick & Kew Swans FC offers women in the area the chance to learn or return to football in a welcoming environment. The sessions are open to women aged 18 to 81+ with no previous experience necessary.

Although the growth of female football continues to accelerate, most females over the age of 25 never had the same chances to play and participate as are available today. Therefore, the aim of the Swans football programme is to provide an opportunity for this age group to play and help reduce the risk of this group becoming a lost generation.

Swans FC was initially piloted in Twickenham and now regularly attracts close to 50 players over its two weekly sessions on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. The sessions attract a broad spectrum of players including women who have never played before and women who have played before but dropped out of the sport due to changes in lifestyle and life stage and parents of youth footballers keen to better understand the game their children play and / or to help support their knowledge of the game as managers and coaches.

The sessions are welcoming and inclusive with the emphasis on keeping fit, meeting friends and having fun. Due to the early success of this, the ambition for Swans FC is to expand to neighbouring areas with the new session in Chiswick now open on Monday evenings. Details:

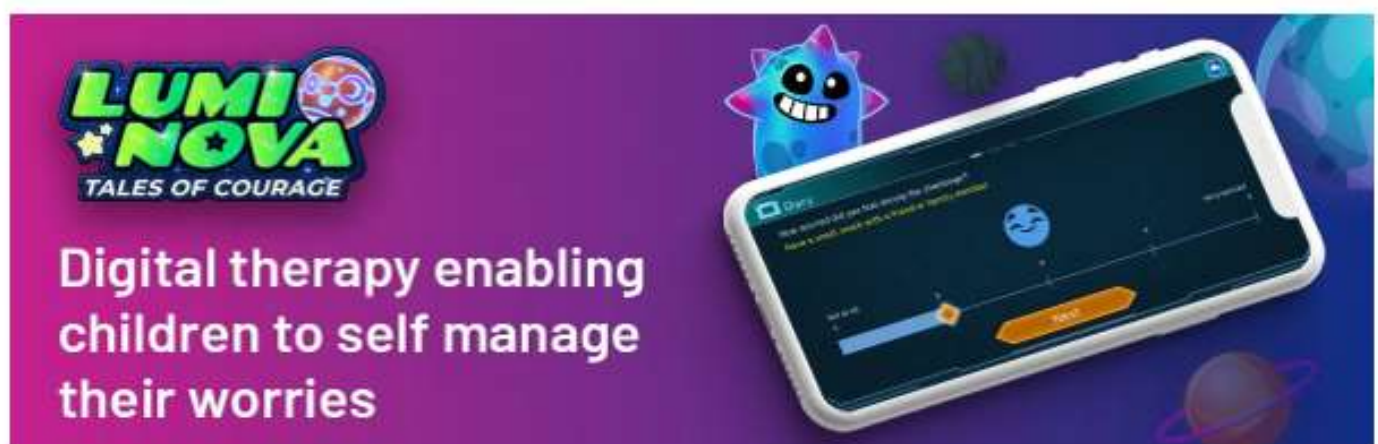

Good oral hygiene habits should be set from a young age. We encourage parents and caregivers to take their children to the dentist and teach them how to care for their teeth and gums.

As you go through life, you should continue to brush your teeth twice a day and floss between your teeth. Cut down on sugar and continue to go for your regular dental check-ups.

Dangers of Meningitis and Septicaemia

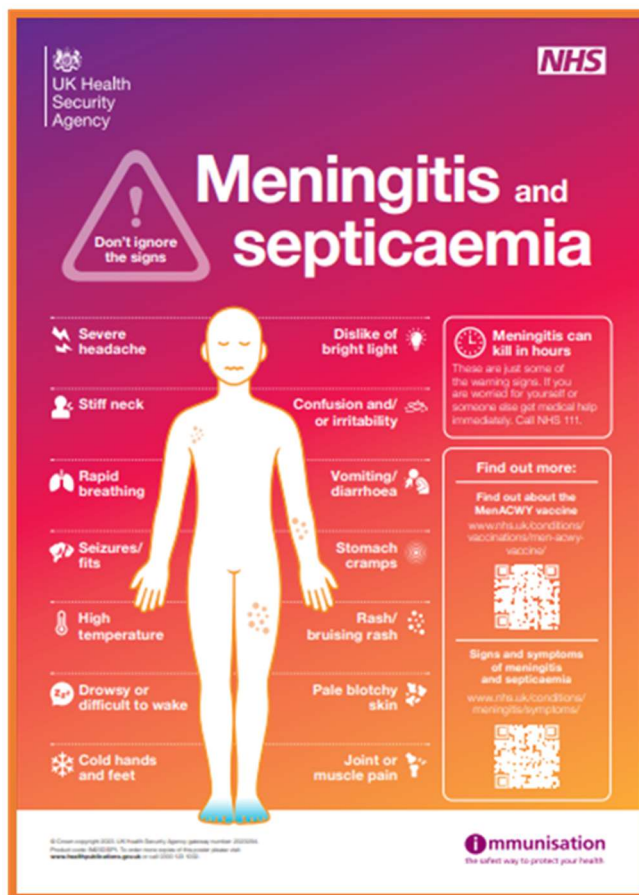
Recently, I was very saddened to hear of a fatal case of meningitis over the February half term of a Year 2 pupil in a school in Ealing.
