Message from the Headteacher

It's not just the full range of weather that we have seen this week in school, but learning and achievement activities in all their forms. We loved welcoming you to celebrate with your children at the Rocksteady concert and Home Learning Project presentations throughout the week. I hope you found the parent teacher consultations useful on Monday and I am excited to let you know that we will be implementing the Learning Ladders tool over the next term, so that you can benefit from more frequent updates on your children's learning, progress and next steps at home.

I had a really purposeful meeting with children from our school's **Eco-Committee** at the start of the week. As a result, they were able to present two environmental initiatives at assembly today that we will be moving forward with as a school:

- The first is the creative **Message In A Bottle Top** project delivered via the National Schools Partnership which encourages children (and the community) to think about plastic waste. The Eco Committee have asked all children not to throw away any plastic items during the spring holiday, but instead, wash it and collect it, before bringing it into school after the holidays. The children will then create a design using the recycled items. I have included a letter from the organisers in the newsletter so that you can investigate in further detail. If you would like to be involved in this project, either in creative delivery or in promotion, do please let the school office know.
- The second is to take part in the **Big Battery Hunt** once again, to recycle batteries that have run out of charge. Children just need to bring batteries in, as and when they are no longer of any use, and recycle them in one of the collection points around school.

I was delighted to find out that our school is one of only 25 selected nationally to take part in a project centred on **Marcus Sedgewick's novel 'Floodland'**. This is a wonderful opportunity for Year 5 children to engage with a range of learning experiences, including webinars delivered by the author.

On Monday, Miss Rees and I had the opportunity to listen to the **performance poetry** entries. The standard was incredible; so impressive. The children's ideas and language were thoughtful and mature. The winning entries are being forwarded to Eastside Partnership, for inclusion in an anthology of child authored poetry, with the potential to perform in the West End once again. Congratulations to:

Miss Jones is organising videos of the children performing their poems to be filmed and uploaded to the Communication Curriculum section of the website.

The student council were absolutely thrilled with the decision and have already asked me when I will be placing the order!



Free Money for Childcare <https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/>

It is a really difficult time at the moment with bills, rent and food prices all soaring. At The William Hogarth School we are continually looking at ways to help out our community and try to alleviate some of the pressures families are facing. As a new parent I have recently been told about **Tax -Free Childcare** which is a government scheme to help working families with the costs of childcare. What I didn't realise is that it is not only for 15/30 hours free childcare for nursery aged children (if entitled) but also includes wrap around provision such as **breakfast and after-school care** as well as **after-school clubs** for children up to the age of 11.

Tax-Free Childcare is a bank account that is set up in your child's name and for every £8 you put in, the government will top up with another £2, up to a maximum of £2000 a year. You must pay out to an organisation that is Ofsted registered - (schools and lots of sports clubs are) and then you pay for your provision through the scheme.

Free school meals

Although every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be offered a free school meal at lunch time, families of children in every year group receiving certain benefits are still required to complete an online application form. This includes Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children. Your children are entitled to free school meals if you receive one of the below benefits:

- Universal Credit and have an annual income of no more than £7,400
- Child Tax Credit, but not entitled to a Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by the Inland Revenue) of no more than £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- or are being supported by the National Asylum Support Service (NASS)

Applications for free school meals cannot be backdated.




