Message from Ms Stockley

Dear Families.

I have been working closely with the Parent Playground Committee this week - we are absolutely thrilled to let you know that the Local Authority has secured funding to install fixed playground equipment. This is amazing news for our school community and is testament to the advocacy that has been going on behind the scenes on behalf of our children. I have lots of meetings in my diary next week with suppliers and designers and I am anticipating that our playground will look very different indeed before too long.

Our vision of *Excellence for All* continues across all aspects of the school's work. A key feature of this is ensuring our classroom team are enabled to maintain momentum in propelling excellence in learning – developing highly skilled leaders and practitioners is foundational to achieving our academic ambitions for the children. As a result, I am pleased to let you know that:

- Mr Hannah continues to develop our school's expertise in Maths Mastery by commencing the formal certification process with the NCETM to become accredited as a National Maths Specialist.
- Last night, myself and Miss Simango joined other headteachers and teachers who have been accepted onto UCL's Cultural Education Leadership programme. This is a very exciting development for our school it will build on our strengths in music, enabling us to further develop our Arts programme.
- Miss Cowell is commencing her training as a Leader of SEND (NPQ SEN), so that inclusion (a hot topic in the press at the moment) remains an area of strength in our school. This will support the work of Mrs Luciani in this arena

This week, I have been liaising with the team at Chiswick House and Gardens to investigate how our school can get involved with the 'Letting the Light In' project that they are running. We have scheduled dates in so that the whole school can participate and it will be a wonderful opportunity for the children to get hands-on in the gardens.

As always, the school diary is full of events, trips and visits. Next week, we are supporting the wonderful work of MacMillan on Thursday morning – do please come along and have a cup of tea and a slice of cake. On Friday, we will be holding our first House Challenge of the year and FOWHS are hosting a welcome cake sale. I hope to see you at one (or more) of the events.

In art, the children have been studying spirals and how different body movements can influence their designs. They've experimented with drawing spirals while standing, sitting at tables, and even lying on their tummies, noticing how each position affects their artwork.

PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING

PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING WILL SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AND SCHOOL

Please check if you are eligible for the governments Pupil Premium Funding/Free School Meals. This can be a massive help for your child and the school. The more families that are eligible and are in receipt of this will give the school more funding from the Government worth up to £1,300 per year!

Our school can use this extra funding to spend on enrichment activities, teacher development, and targeted support for the children that need it most. This may also entitle you to other benefits like food vouchers, after school clubs and the Holiday Activity Food Programme (HAF).

It may sound complicated, but it's really easy to apply!

If your household receives one of the benefits below, you may be entitled to this funding: -

- *Income Support
- *Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- *Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- *Universal Credit with a household income of less than £7,400 per year after tax and not including any benefit you receive
- *Child Tax Credit, provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- *Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- *Are supported by the National Asylum Support Service (NASS).
