Dear Parents,

This Governor newsletter is a summary of our work over the past few months and is intended to keep you informed of what the Governing Body has been doing.

Our most recent meeting took place on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May, and we welcomed Rebecca Fitzgerald as our newest Governor, ensuring the Governing Board now has a full complement of members. We also said goodbye to our former Chair of Governors, Debra Kane, who has worked tirelessly for the school for the past seven years. We shared our huge thanks with Debra and wished her well for her future endeavours.

At the meeting, Ms Stockley provided a very promising analysis of the children's achievements at school, especially how well prepared the Year 6 children were for their SATS this week. We hope this preparation pays dividends and the children get the results they deserve. The Governors were also really impressed to hear more about the wide array of extra-curricular activities and trips that are available to the children at William Hogarth School. These experiences add such a valuable element to the children's education.

The school leadership has a robust system of monitoring and evaluating the work of the school. As part of our role as Governors, we check different aspects throughout the year.

We were impressed by the school's Attendance as targets set by the government are high and the school is doing the best it can to support children and their families in achieving these. The safeguarding of pupils continues to be a strength of the school. The lead governor visited the school at the end of April to monitor school processes and compliance and found everything was in order and that the record keeping procedures were a strength.

As with many schools across the country, financial pressures continue to put a strain on the leadership and management at the school. A huge amount of work is going on behind the scenes to address these financial challenges. Despite this, Governors were impressed by the efforts of Ms Stockley and her team to still ensure an impressive educational offering is available to the parents and pupils. This is testament to the dedicated staff that we are fortunate enough to have at William Hogarth.

Lastly, and to end of a very positive note, we are happy to report that budget has been secured from the Local Authority for a full refurbishment of the playground and work has already started as you may have seen. We look forward to seeing the students play with the new equipment.

We hope you and your children have a wonderful summer term, and we look forward to updating you further at the end of the academic year.

## Message from Ms Stockley

Dear Families,

This week, children in Year 6 completed the national SATs assessments – the challenging end of Key Stage 2 tests. As always, the SATs were robust, requiring the children to work carefully, diligently and analytically in order to demonstrate all of their incredible learning from the past four years. I am sure you will have seen numerous posts on X and in the papers, critical of the construction of both the Reading paper and second maths paper. In spite of this, I was unsurprised and very proud of the way our Year 6 pupils rose to the challenge, getting their heads down to the task at hand – an absolute testament to their strength of character, sense of purpose and determination to do themselves and their teachers proud. I know you will join me in commending them.

I hope that many of you are delighted with the results of phase 1 of the Playground regeneration. Although it feels like 'baby-steps', it marks a great first step towards helping us achieve our ultimate goals. The children are really enjoying the more open environment in the back playground and even such small steps feel transformational – it has already created some real buzz and momentum around the school. So that we continue to build momentum, Alice (FOWHS Chair) and I met towards the end of last week, and placed an order for 'loose parts' to support the children's technical and imaginative play in the outside. The site team are going to refresh a dedicated storage space for the resources and we are excited to roll this out to the children as soon as possible. I also held a contractor meeting this week to begin the process of tendering the Local Authority foundational works. Huge thanks to everyone involved in making our dreams a reality.

As ever, next week looks to be another busy one for staff, pupils and families! The whole school are taking part in the 'Walk To School Week' initiative – do have a look at the wonderful posters the children created if you haven't already had a chance. We also have the athlete visit to look forward to, plus numeracy day on Wednesday, as well as a Bingo event on Thursday after school, hosted by the FOWHS.

## Upper Key Stage 2 River Thames Boat Trip

On Friday 3rd May, Years 4, 5 and 6 went on a geography fieldwork trip to the River Thames. The children completed some work on dry land at Chiswick Pier, which included reading ordnance survey maps; learning how to and using 6-figure grid references; recognising the geographical changes to the landscape around the River Thames in the last 100 years; and how long the River Thames is depending on if it is low or high tide.

Next, the children boarded the Golden Salamander and got to learn more about the River Thames and experience it from the water. One child said that they, 'felt nervous as they had never been on a boat before', and another said 'it was spectacular'.

On the boat the children continued their map work by spotting and naming bridges as well as finding landmarks along the water's edge. Lots of bird spotting took place with the children seeing cormorants, grey herons, Canada geese, mute swans and mallards. The children also found out the importance of the year 1858: the year known as 'The Great Stink', when the River Thames was so polluted that an act in Parliament was passed to clean up the River and to stop industries putting chemicals, rubbish, hot water and human and animal waste into it.

A trip out onto the deck to see some fellow water enthusiasts brought our amazing fieldwork trip to a close.

The children had a fantastic day and were so engaged and enthusiastic. A real credit to the school.






Garden activities for children from 18 Months to 5 years to encourage eating. Being outdoors is great for children and gardening offers lots of fun and learning opportunities that support their development.


