After a little break, and the exciting Jubilee celebrations, we are settled back into our usual routine. We hope you enjoyed the Jubilee Picnic.




Some changes to our timetable:

Free school meals

Although every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be offered a free school meal at lunch time, families of children in every year group receiving certain benefits are still required to complete an online application form. This includes Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children. This can help the school raise extra funds.

Your children are entitled to free school meals if you receive one of the below benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal Credit and have an annual income of no more than £7,400
- Child Tax Credit, but not entitled to a Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by the Inland Revenue) of no more than £16,190
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- or are being supported by the National Asylum Support Service (NASS)

Applications for free school meals cannot be backdated.

It is a really difficult time at the moment with bills, rent and food prices all soaring. At The William Hogarth School we are continually looking at ways to help out our community and try to alleviate some of the pressures families are facing. As a new parent I have recently been told about **Tax -Free Childcare** which is a government scheme to help working families with the costs of childcare. What I didn't realise is that it is not only for 15/30 hours free childcare for nursery aged children (if entitled) but also includes wrap around provision such as **breakfast and after-school care** as well as **after-school clubs** for children up to the age of 11.

Tax-Free Childcare is a bank account that is set up in your child's name and for every £8 you put in, the government will top up with another £2, up to a maximum of £2000 a year. You must pay out to an organisation that is Ofsted registered - (schools and lots of sports clubs are) and then you pay for your provision through the scheme.
