### The William Hogarth School is Going to the Polls!

On Friday 21st June, pupils at The William Hogarth School will be casting their votes alongside thousands of other young people in England and Wales in the 'Our Generation, Our Vote' project. This project has been created so that children and young people under 18 get to have their views heard by adults and the people who make political decisions. Each child is learning about democracy, what local and central government does, how laws are made and what MPs do. They will be reading the manifestos set out by each of the main political parties early next week - once they have been published.

Polls will open in the main school hall on Friday 21st at 9:30am. Each child will receive their ballot paper to cast their vote and voting will close once all children have voted and placed their ballots in the secure boxes.

Votes will be uploaded and results from across the country will be announced via the media and available online on Friday 28th June. We hope for the children to be able to view the announcement live during the school day.
