Message from the Headteacher

Half term has arrived, although it hardly seems possible! It is lovely to be able to finish the half term on a high note and I am thrilled to bits to share our Phonics Screening results with you. Normally, children sit their phonics screening check in the summer term of Year 1 - obviously, this did not take place last year because of COVID-19 school closures. The government therefore instructed that all children in Year 2 should undertake the check during the October period of this academic year.

Our Year 2 children have completed their phonics screening check this October with an amazing 100% success rate for all children who were with us in Year 1.

This phenomenal result is attributable to the new phonics scheme that we introduced in 2018, the consistently outstanding teaching of phonics in the school and your support in keeping up with your phonics practice during the lockdown period. Thank you staff, children and parents – you are amazing!

There have been a few questions and queries about the fund-raising target on Rocket Fund. Although this is different to the amount noted in the newsletter some weeks ago, this is attributable to the fact that we are seeking funds for all of the equipment we would like to purchase and make available to the children, rather than just the core essentials. Obviously, if we don't reach the absolute target, we will start by purchasing core essentials and then build up towards purchasing the other items. Part of the increased fund-raising amount will also help us to ensure that any equipment purchased has a designated storage spot – this will help to ensure it is a resource that the children can use, enjoy and have access to for years to come. Thank you to everyone who has already made a donation – your generosity is very much appreciated.

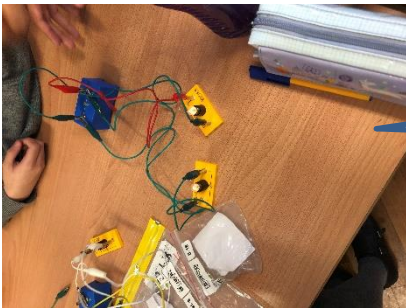

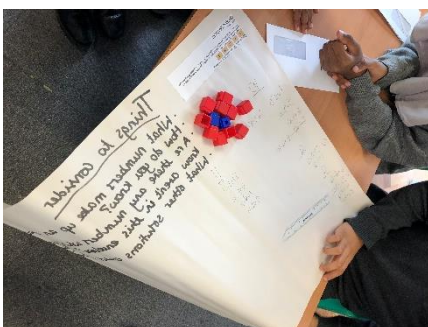
Here are a few things that we have been up to so far.

Please read the '**Secondary School Transfer September 2021**' brochure carefully before completing your application. A copy can be downloaded from our website.

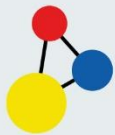

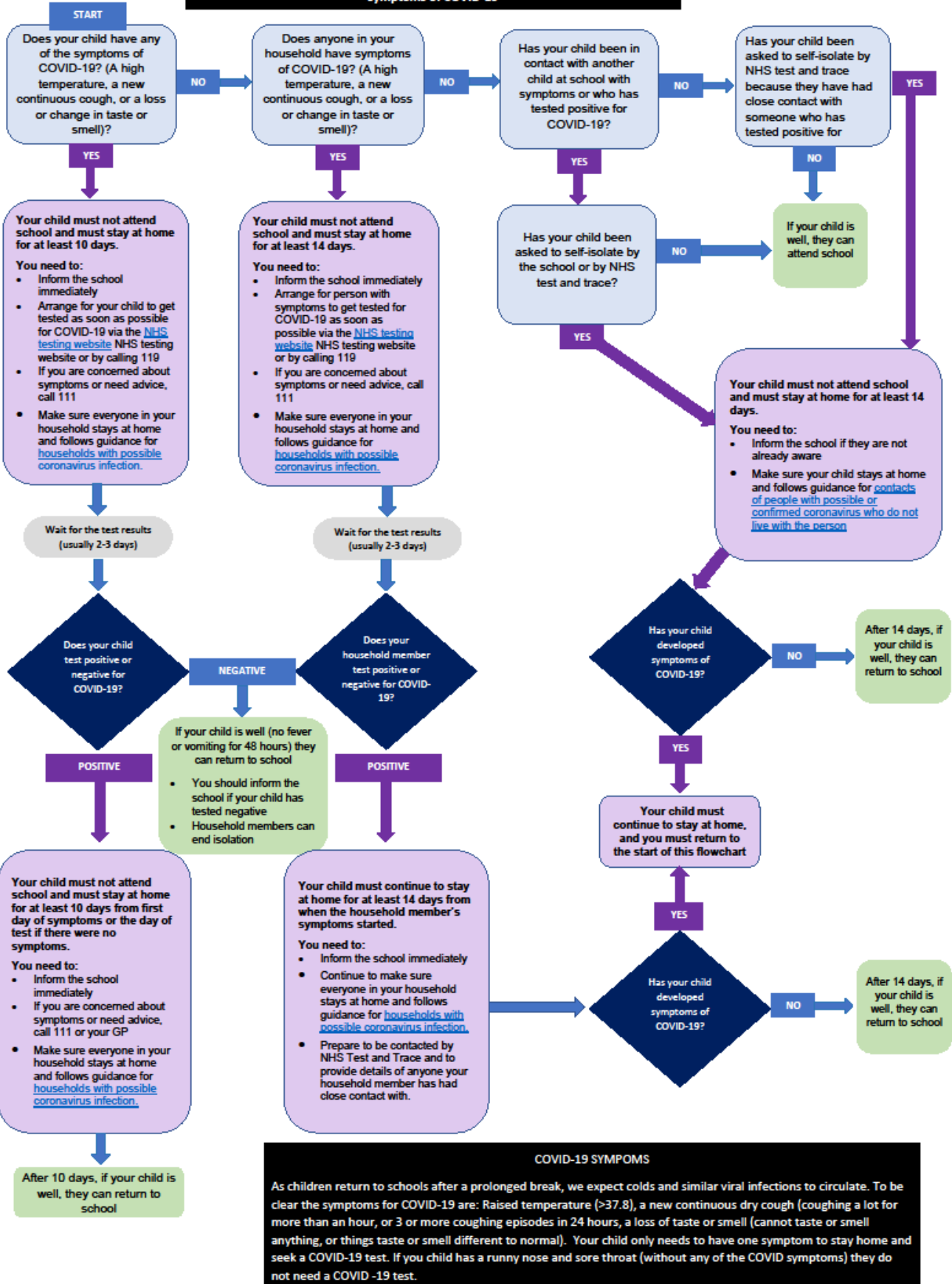

Parent/Guardian: What to do if your child or someone in your household has symptoms of COVID-19



COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

As children return to schools after a prolonged break, we expect colds and similar viral infections to circulate. To be clear the symptoms for COVID-19 are: Raised temperature (>37.8), a new continuous dry cough (coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours, a loss of taste or smell (cannot taste or smell anything, or things taste or smell different to normal). Your child only needs to have one symptom to stay home and seek a COVID-19 test. If you child has a runny nose and sore throat (without any of the COVID symptoms) they do not need a COVID -19 test.

School Uniform at The William Hogarth School

Our school uniform colours are grey, white, yellow and black. Our official uniform can be purchased on-line at www.stevensons.co.uk where we have a school page set up showing our school uniform. All non-logo'd items are cheaply available at many high street stores and supermarkets. We expect every child to wear school uniform when attending school and when participating in school organised events outside normal school hours. We expect children to be wearing the correct footwear for sports and games and for all items of uniform to be labelled clearly with your child's name.
