




Summer 1 Term Newsletter Year 4



English

This term we shall explore the book "Arthur and the Golden Rope". This is a fantastic adventure story from Norse mythology following the journey of Arthur to help Thor catch the wicked Fenrir. We will be using this book as the stimulus for our writing this half-term. Our main focus will be on extending ideas/ sentences using more information. We will incorporate history into our English lessons to complete the essay for this half-term.



Maths

We continue to look at decimals this half-term. We will be focussing on making a whole, writing and comparing decimals and rounding them. We will then move onto money looking at pounds and pence, giving change and applying the 4 operations into it. We will also be focussing on times tables.



Science

We will be learning all about the human body. We will be looking at the organs, bones, comparing our bodies to that of animals, teeth and the circulatory and digestive systems.

P.E.

We will have tennis sessions from Dukes Meadow coaches again in year 4 this half-term and we will also be taking part in athletics. We will incorporate in life skills like teamwork, leadership and healthy living.

PSHE

Year 4 will be focusing on how to build positive relationships with peers. Looking into how we can show respect, solving conflicts etc.



R.E.

This term we will be learning about Judaism and the beliefs behind rights of passage. The overall question will be

'What is the best way for a Jew to show commitment to God?'

Computing

We will be looking at data logging using computer software. We will be looking at the best ways to obtain and store data using computers.

Music

We will look at numerous techniques involved in singing e.g. rhythm, tone and pace. This will be taught by music specialists.

Humanities

Year 4 will be learning the Vikings in history this half-term. We will look into Viking England, where they came from, Lindisfarne, how they travelled and what they found, important Viking figures and answering the overall question

'How did the Vikings change Britain?'
