English

We will focusing on properties of shape, position and direction and volume. We will continue to focus on problem solving, creating stem sentences and reasoning strategies.

P.E.


Our focus will be taking part in Rounders this term (Tuesday) and on a Thursday, the children will be having swimming lessons at our local swimming pool.

Science

We will be learning about 'Cells'. Over the course of the term the children will be exploring 'Living and non-living things', 'the main organ systems of the body and the different cells in the body and in plants.'

PSHE

Year 5 will be investigation 'Changing Me', where they will learn about self-image, how our bodies change and how to respect changes.



Humanities

Year 5 will be learning about Energy and Sustainability and answering this essay question: - "Humans are not capable of living sustainably." To what extent do you agree?

The children have been set some home learning creative tasks to complement their learning in the classroom.

Computing

We will be exploring Lego WeDo. Pupils will be using lego to explore, create and test a volcano project. They will also learn how to code and debug a programme.

Art

We will be creating sea sculptures using plastic bottles as we explore how plastic pollution in our seas and oceans is an important environmental issue.

Music

EXPLORING MUSICAL NOTATION - This unit uses the musical skills children have developed this year and in previous years in listening activities, small group composition and improvisations. Children will learn to describe music, to recognise sounds and to create foley, background music and advertising jingles. Children will learn about how music can create an atmosphere or conjure up a certain emotion or experience from a viewer when used for film and television.
