English

We are reading the book called *Seen and not heard*, a story set in a stately home where the portraits come alive at night. The book should help us to come up with some character narrative writing where we will include expanded noun phrases and direct speech.



Computing

We will be programming on Scratch. We will develop our understanding of sequencing and the links between events and actions.



PSHE In PSHE we are learning about relationships: family relationships and friendships, conflict and online safety. There will be plenty of opportunities to reflect on our own relationships and skills that help our relationships run smoothly.

Maths

Time will include problem solving, comparing and working out durations and telling the time to the minute. Please practise with your child as this can often be a difficult concept for children to understand.

Our unit is telling stories through drawing and making. We will take inspiration from literature and make work in 3 dimensions in response.

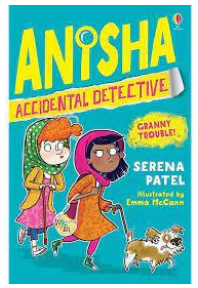


R.E.
