

# Year 3 Summer Home Learning Projects

<p>Make a travel brochure about Ancient Greece, focusing on its ancient history. Where would you travel to? Where would you stay? What could you do while you were there? What would you recommend to visit? Use pictures with lots of facts and information. Include monuments and buildings with a special interest for tourists.</p>	<p>Make an A-Z of Greece. Think about presenting your work in the best way possible. Use Greek symbols! You could add an illustration to each or some of the letters along with your sentences.</p>	<p>Design your own Labyrinth. It could be made of straws, string or wood.</p> 	<p>Visit a Greek restaurant. Take a camera and ask them if you can take pictures of the food, maybe even as they prepare it. Look at the menu. How it is different to traditional English food? Design your own Greek menu, write a report about your visit, take pictures and label them or make a poster.</p>	<p>Create a picture of an imaginary Greek God. Make sure your poster is eye-catching and full of facts and information. Try to think of a symbol for your God.</p>
<p>Research an ancient Greek recipe that is still eaten today! Write up the recipe, try and make the recipe, even bring it to school to share with your class.</p> 	<p>Turn a myth into a cartoon, for example, Theseus and the Minotaur. Use lots of speech bubbles.</p> 	<p>Research as much as you can about the Greek army, their uniform and their weapons. You might like to make a helmet or a shield!</p> 	<p>Greek Temples :Temples were important buildings in Greece. Research what they looked like and how they were built, then make your own model temple.</p> 	<p>Myths and Monsters :The ancient Greeks made up stories called myths to help them understand the world. Their stories were tales of gods, heroes and mythical creatures. Make up your own Greek myth and present it however you wish.</p>
