





English and Literacy have continued to see some really exciting devel-william Perkin opments in the last term. KS3 Book Club has been run by Ms Dixon every week of the term and has seen students talk about what superpowers they would have and the powers of telekinesis as they read 'The Possible'. Mr Blake has been reading '1984' with KS4 Book Club to give us some really exciting ideas about how political authorities can abuse their power.

We have also seen an incredible 18 KS4 reading mentors trained to help Y7s develop their reading skills; every Monday, they meet and catch up about their books before they start reading together. The Y7s are really grateful for their help We've also been working with a reading charity, Bookmark, this year. Six incredible Y12s have been spending half-an-hour every week to read with Primary School children who struggle with reading. They've been put through a real-



ly challenging interview and training process and are now sharing their love of reading with an even wider community!

Year 10 took part in Speak Out – they were given the opportunity to think deeply about topics that mattered to them before competing between forms and in assembly. There were so many fantastic speakers, and congratulations to our grand champion Kuba! He, along with runner up Baani, will be competing to secure a win for the school during the borough finals which will be hosted here on the 21st January 2025.



And finally, creative writing continues to be a really important part of what we do here. Many students will be entering the Daunt Books Children's Short Story Competition – entries can be up to 1500 words and



continued to have huge success with students published in the Young Writers' Awards anthologies over the last term!




Sports Report for the Autumn term

Science at William Perkin this term

This term has been a characteristically busy one for WP science team!



We started the year celebrating the incredible achievements of our students

High School
at both GCSE and A-level. Many of last year's Y13 went on to study science and engineering based courses at top universities around the country. Over 25% of 6th formers going on to science degrees

We then had our annual launch of the Eliote Scientists project; this year the group of students from Y7-9 will focus on 'Investigating the Synaesthetic Elements in Non-Synaesthetic Students' with Brunel University. Year 7 students also took part in a research study run by UCL's Department of Behavioural Science and Health – investigating the range of healthy weight and eating messages which children are exposed to.

The Bertha Earth programme began with an exciting launch day, where all Year 7 students got a taste of what the programme has to offer. The Bertha Earth facilitators were blown away by the enthusiasm and energy of the Year 7 cohort! Following the launch day, 30 outstanding ambassadors were selected to take part in the programme based on their impressive applications. Through workshops, the ambassadors have explored connection with nature and learned about the concept of Ubuntu—the idea that we are all interconnected and thrive together. A highlight of the programme was the trip to the Walthamstow Wetlands, where students immersed themselves in nature by birdwatching and doing some conservation work. Together, they cleared bushes to make the area more welcoming for wildlife, demonstrating how small actions can create a big impact!

In November, 20 students from Year 9 and Year 10 visited the offices of RED Engineering in

central London and spent the day learning and working as engineers. They attended presentations from a range of engineers and learned fundamentals about different fields of engineering. They then used what they had learnt to make their own insulated and sustainable houses out of paper, with solar-powered lights. This was a really enjoyable trip, which has opened new subject and careers choices for students. Also in November Dr Doyle organised a team to take part in a very high level Chemistry competition from the RSC. Our team of 4 came 10th out of 67 schools and were the only non fee-paying/non-selective school in the top 10. An incredible achievement!
