That Buddhism is a world religion.

What do I need to know? Key Knowledge - Buddhism

Buddhism was founded by Siddhartha Gautama who lived in India in sixth-century BCE. Gautama reached enlightenment at the age of 35 and was given the title of 'Buddha.' This means he found a way to free himself from the cycle of desire and suffering. He taught his followers how to achieve this too.

Buddhism is based on the Four Noble Truths:

1. Life is made up of pain and suffering.
2. All suffering is caused by our desires.
3. The freedom from desire and the end of suffering is called Nirvana. This is a state of peace and happiness and a goal that everyone can move towards.
4. The Eightfold Path – following these leads to Nirvana.

The Eightfold Path is a practical guide to living out the teachings of Buddha in everyday life.

Buddhists worship in a temple or at home. Some Buddhists have a shrine in their own home with a statue of Buddha.

Buddhist Monks and Nuns

Some Buddhists choose to leave their family and live as monks or nuns. They dedicate their lives to sharing the teachings of Buddha. They wear orange robes and shave their heads. Monks and Nuns rely on the kindness of others for their food, shelter and clothes.
