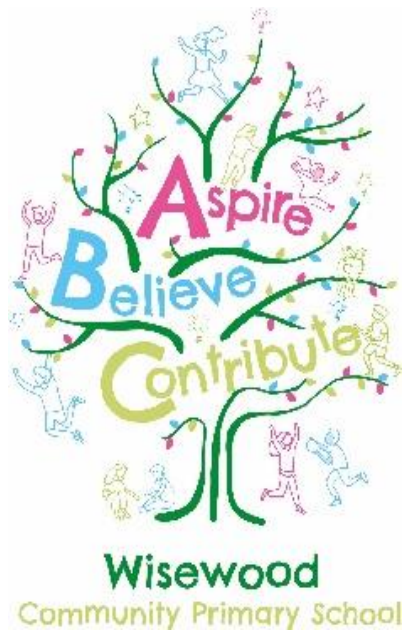

Geography Curriculum Intent

At Wisewood, our intent for Geography is to enable children to enjoy a rich and broad understanding of the world around them and the necessary skills through the delivery of a purposeful, engaging curriculum. We encourage pupils to believe in themselves, build resilience and become creative, critical thinkers. We aspire to empower our children in becoming inquisitive geographers and give our children a better understanding of the ways in which they contribute to society and the wider world. Our engaging and active geography planning will help raise cultural capital and enable a clear understanding of their own surroundings as well as develop connections through people and events in different places. The carefully constructed learning experiences will instill a curiosity and wonder which will remain with our children for the rest of their lives.

- It is our intention that all children develop a sense of place that is contextual.
- It is our intention that children are knowledgeable about globally significant places, both terrestrial and marine - including their defining physical and human characteristics.
- It is our intention that children acquire the necessary skills to interpret a range of sources of geographical information in particular maps, diagrams, globes, aerial photographs and Geographical Information Systems (GIS).
- It is our intention that children experience fieldwork, enabling them to collect, analyse and communicate with a range of data.
- It is our intention that children develop a progressive geographical vocabulary that enables them to confidently communicate their ideas and opinions.
- It is our intention that children deepen their understanding of geographical processes by constructing and communicating informed responses that involve thoughtful selection and organisation of relevant geographical information.
- It is our intention that children appreciate how wonderfully diverse our world is.
