

History Curriculum Intent

At Wisewood, our intent for History is to enable children to enjoy a rich and broad understanding of key historical knowledge and skills through the delivery of a purposeful, engaging curriculum. We encourage pupils to believe in themselves, build resilience and become creative, critical thinkers. We aspire to empower our children in becoming historians and give our children a better understanding of the ways in which they contribute to society and the wider world. Our history curriculum provides children with the opportunities and experiences to improve their cultural and social capital whilst having a clear understanding of their own heritage.

- It is our intention that all children develop a sense of chronology across British and, local and world history that enables them to talk with confidence about the past referring to historical terms, dates and periods, whilst noting connections, contrasts and trends over time.
- It is our intention that children are knowledgeable about a range of historically significant individuals that have brought about important change within a period of History in which they have lived.
- It is our intention that children acquire the necessary skills to investigate and interpret events from the past using a range of sources of evidence that address questions, some of which children devise themselves, about change, cause, similarity, difference and significance.
- It is our intention that children can reflect on events that have taken place in the past and discuss how they have impacted on their own lives and how they live.
- It is our intention that children describe and explain events from the past constructing and communicating informed responses that involve thoughtful selection and organisation of relevant historical information.
- It is our intention that children develop a progressive historical vocabulary that enables them to confidently communicate their ideas and opinions.
