Christians believe in God. They may go to Church to pray and celebrate special events. Christians believe Jesus is the Son of God, that we celebrate his birth at Christmas and his death and resurrection at Easter.

Previous Understanding

That a Church is special place to a Christian because it helps them feel close to God.

That Muslims and Christians both believe in God, but their beliefs are different.

Endpoints:	<p>Knowledge:</p> <p>A mosque is a Muslim place of worship and a church is a Christian place of worship.</p> <p>A mosque has key objects and artefacts that you won't find in a church – for example. Minaret, Minbar, Washing Area and Prayer Mats.</p> <p>A church has key objects and artefacts that you won't find in a mosque – for example, Font, Pulpit and Altar.</p> <p>Skills:</p> <p>Compare and contrast both buildings finding similarities and differences.</p>
