OuRRSay Squad Update – 5th March 2026

This week, the OuRRSay Squad focused entirely on the theme of *Belonging* and discussed how staff can help every child feel part of the WCLA family. Pupils suggested that teachers greeting children each morning, joining in playtime games and noticing when someone is sad would make a big difference. They also shared ideas such as wholeschool playtimes, a weekly running challenge, a 'Celebrating Differences' day and staff giving positive compliments daily, especially when children return from absence.

Next week, the Squad will explore how *children* themselves can actively contribute to a sense of belonging. This work supports **CRC Article 29 (education should help children develop confidence and respect)** and **Article 31 (children's right to relax, play and join in activities)**.



Car Safety

We would like to remind all families about the importance of car safety when travelling to and from school. By law in the UK, all children must use an appropriate car seat or seat belt when travelling in a car. Children should normally use a suitable child car seat until they are 12 years old or 135cm tall (whichever comes first). While children can legally travel in the front seat, they must still use the correct car seat for their age or height, and it is important that rear-facing seats are never used in a front seat with an active airbag. Please help us keep all our pupils safe by ensuring that every child is properly secured with a seat belt or car seat on every journey. National Oral Health Survey of 5 Year Old Schoolchildren

On Tuesday 10th March, staff from Bridgewater Community Healthcare NHS Trust will be coming into school to carry out a dental health needs assessment for children aged 5 years.

If your child was born between 11th March 2020 and 12th March 2021, you will receive a paper consent form. We ask that you complete the 1st page in full and return it to school by **Friday 6th March** 2026 in preparation for the survey which will take place in school on Tuesday 10th March. *If your child's birthday falls outside the dates shown above, your child will not be included in the survey and you do not need to complete a form.*

Active Travel Competition 2026

Bikeability instructors are inviting children who have taken part in Bikeability (Level 1& 2) in South Cheshire to take part in an ACTIVE TRAVEL poster competition. The aim of the competition is to encourage youngsters to be more active and be safer on the roads especially when riding their bikes.

The competition winner and runner-up will receive a certificate and a bag of goodies as prizes.

All entries will be collected from school before the Easter school holidays by the competition organisers, who alongside a local member of the emergency services, will judge the competition. **Please bring all completed posters to the school office by Friday 20th March.**

If your child would like to get involved they are invited to create an A4 size POSTER that ENCOURAGES ACTIVE TRAVEL (cycling, walking, scooting and wheeling or using public transport) using paint, crayon felt pen or pencil.

Posters should be 'eye-catching' and highlighting the benefits and the various ways to take part in Active Travel in a clear and creative way. The pupil's name and school should be written on the back of the poster.

Examples of Active Travel:

- Using a safe walking route like a footpath
- Cycling, scooting or skateboarding safely to school
- Riding with a parent if you're still learning road safety skills
- Walking with a family member or in a supervised buddy group
- Park and walk by getting dropped off a short distance away and walking the rest
- Using public transport, such as a bus, which is more eco-friendly than travelling by car

Benefits of Active Travel:

- Improve health
- Better air quality
- Economic benefits
- Reduces carbon emissions
- Improves community safety

Yes

The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering appointments for parents and carers at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held every half term in both North and South localities. These informal sessions are an opportunity to discuss concerns, seek advice and explore strategies to support your child or young person. Our focus areas are **Cognition and Learning** and **SEMH (Social, Emotion and Mental Health)** needs. They are not sessions for local authority processes (e.g. EHCs or placement changes) or child assessments.

Examples of Topics include:

- Literacy, Maths or Executive Function difficulties
- Anxiety or school related issues
- Play, social skills or friendship needs
- Transitions and/or difficulties with change/loss
- Preparing for Adulthood
