

OuRRSay Squad Update - 15th May

This week, the OuRRSay Squad continued their work on *Belonging*, focusing on peer support and student leadership. Pupils shared thoughtful ideas about how older children could support younger ones, including helping with reading, practising times tables and widening the role of Mental Health Champions across the school. They also suggested increasing opportunities for children to play together and expanding the range of buddy roles. Pupils discussed possible leadership roles, such as Head Boy/Girl or Team Captains, with classes set to share their preferences. Children reflected that learning about different cultures through RE, English and No Outsiders helps everyone feel recognised and valued. This work supports

CRC Article 15 (the right to take part in groups and school life) and Article 12 (children's right to have their views heard).



Car Park Safety

Reception and Year 6 Height & Weight Checks – Wednesday 20th May

The School Health Screening Team are scheduled to complete height & weight checks for Reception and Year 6 pupils in school on Wednesday 20th May.

If parents are happy for their child to be measured, they do not need to do anything.

If you do not want your child's height and weight to be measured, or your child has a medical condition that affects their height or weight, please let the School Health Screening Team know directly by emailing them at whc.southscreeners@nhs.net (preferred) or alternatively by phone if you are unable to email at 0300 123 4058. Please do this ASAP.

Children will not be made to take part on the day if they do not want to.

Census Day - Thursday 21st May

We would be very grateful if every infant pupil was able to have a school dinner on Census Day on Thursday 21st May. Please see the special Census Day menu above.

Money comes into schools in different ways. One way that money comes into its central budget is from infant school dinners. The government pay for children in the infants to have a free meal each day. The money is put into the school budget at the start of September (which we receive monthly). In order to decide how much money to allocate each school, they carry out a census. They work out how many infant children have a dinner on those two days and allocate funds accordingly.

Nessy at Home

Did you know that children can continue using Nessy at home? If your child has access to the school Nessy programme, they can log on from home using their usual school login details and continue playing the learning games and activities. Regular use at home is a great way to support, reading, spelling and phonics skills in a fun and engaging way. If you are unsure of your child's login details, please speak to your child's class teacher who will be happy to help.



Fidget Toys

We have noticed an increasing number of children bringing fidget toys into school and using them during lessons. We understand that, for some children, these can be helpful tools to support focus, concentration, anxiety management, or sensory regulation. However, if a fidget toy is distracting other children or preventing the child from fully engaging with their learning, the class teacher will ask for it to be removed. In these circumstances, the item will be kept safely and returned directly to a parent or carer. Thank you for your support in helping us maintain a calm and focused learning environment for all children.

Swan Stars Payments & Bookings

We kindly ask that all Swan Stars payments are paid in advance of sessions being taken. Ad hoc sessions are due at the time of booking however far in advance this may be. Contracted sessions will be invoiced each month. Please be aware that late payments may result in additional fees or cancellation of sessions. If you have any queries or issues with payments, please contact the school office at the earliest opportunity.

Please ensure that all bookings are made for the correct club (Cygnets, Infants or Juniors) to avoid any sessions having to be cancelled.

Please be aware that all new contract requests for September 2026 will be reviewed on Monday 29th June and remaining places will then be available to book on an ad hoc basis from Tuesday 30th June at 9am. All existing contracts will carry over unless you advise otherwise (4 weeks' notice is required for any amendments/cancellations) and if children are moving key stage (e.g. Cygnets to Infants or Infants to Junior) this will be actioned by school. All bookings/new contracts will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.



The Educational Psychology (EP) Service is offering appointments for parents and carers at Cheshire East Family Hubs, held every half term in both North and South localities. These informal sessions are an opportunity to discuss concerns, seek advice and explore strategies to support your child or young person. Our focus areas are **Cognition and Learning** and **SEMH (Social, Emotion and Mental Health)** needs. They are not sessions for local authority processes (e.g. EHCPs or placement changes) or child assessments.

Examples of Topics include:

- Literacy, Maths or Executive Function difficulties
- Anxiety or school related issues
- Play, social skills or friendship needs
- Transitions and/or difficulties with change/loss
- Preparing for Adulthood
