Only One Week to Go Until Our Colour Run!

We are just one week away from our much-anticipated Colour Run, and everyone is getting very excited! We are keeping our fingers crossed that the weather stays a little cooler than it has been recently so that everyone can enjoy the afternoon safely.

The fun begins at 12.00 noon with our annual Family Picnic, and we look forward to welcoming families onto the school field to enjoy lunch together. Please collect your child(ren) from their classroom door and sign them out with their class teacher. Melbourne Class should be collected from KS2 hall door. At 12.50pm, a whistle will sound to signal that children should be returned to their classrooms ready for the Colour Run. Families are then welcome to stay and watch the event or leave the school site if they wish.

For everyone's safety, all entry and exit to the school site must be via the pedestrian gate by the car park. The gates will only be open between 12.00pm–12.15pm and again from 12.55pm–1.10pm. During the picnic, you are welcome to sit anywhere on the school field. However, once the Colour Run begins, we ask that all spectators remain behind the bunting fence so that the children can enjoy the course safely.

On Friday, children should come to school already dressed in their white Colour Run T-shirt, along with trousers, leggings or shorts and trainers that they do not mind getting covered in colour. If possible, please avoid sending your child to school with a bag on Friday, as the colour powder can transfer onto surfaces after the event. Protective glasses will be given to all participants immediately before the Colour Run begins, and the white T-shirts will be distributed to children on Wednesday next week.

We can't wait to see everyone for what promises to be a fantastic afternoon of fun, laughter and colour!

Smartphone Free Childhood-Cheshire East

Cheshire East are asking families to wait as long as possible before giving their child a smartphone. Cheshire East Council is working with schools to support them becoming smartphone free, following new government guidance. From September 2026, students in Years 7 to 11 will not be able to use smartphones at school at any time (this includes lessons,

breaks and lunchtime). The government also plans to stop social media use for under-16s by spring 2027.

Why does this matter? Smartphones can be helpful, but they can also cause problems for children. Research shows they can lead to:

- Feeling sad, worried or low in confidence
- Problems with sleep and concentration
- Bullying online
- Seeing harmful or upsetting content
- Less time playing, socialising and building friendships

Schools in Cheshire East are seeing more problems caused by phones, especially from things that start online but affect school life. These can include arguments in group chats, stress from social media, and staying up late on phones. Many parents also say they regret giving their child a smartphone too early.

What schools are doing? All state secondary schools in Cheshire East have committed to being smartphone free from September 2026.

- Phones must be out of sight all day
- Some schools will use lockable pouches or lockers

There is no need for a smartphone for learning. If a child needs a device for health or other important reasons, schools will make special arrangements.

What can you do? Cheshire East is asking families to:

- Wait until at least age 14 before giving a smartphone. Choose a simple 'brick phone' if your child needs to call or text. Join other parents at: www.smartphonefreechildhood.co.uk

It can be hard to say no, especially when other children have phones. However, by working together, we can help children: Stay healthy and happy; Sleep well. Build strong friendships; Focus on learning.

Bus Service from Willaston to Malbank

Following the installation of the new crossing at the Peacock roundabout, the Local Authority Transport Team now deem the route from Willaston to Malbank as safe to walk. As a result, they intend to remove the current provision of free school transport from September.

Yes

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over

Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
