DID YOU KNOW?

Fireworks are exciting, but they can be very dangerous. Listen to your grown-up about where is a safe place to stand.



SPARKLERS



TIP #1

Keep your sparkly sparkler safely away from other people and don't run with them.



TIP #2

Once sparklers are finished, put them into a bucket of water, don't pick them back up.



TIP #3

Wear your gloves when you hold sparklers and keep them away from your body.



BONFIRES



TIP #4

Stand at a safe distance from the bonfire and stay close to the grown-ups.



TIP #5

Don't be tempted to throw things into the bonfire or poke at it with sticks.

FIREWORKS



TIP #6

Leave your dressing up clothes at home on fireworks night, wrap up warm instead.



TIP #8

Put toys and phones away when you're out and about so you can focus on keeping safe and having fun!



TIP #7

If you're going to a firework display, hold hands with your grown-up and stay with them all the time.

DON'T PANIC...

If you do catch your clothes on a flame: **STOP, DROP and ROLL**

STOP what you are doing.

DROP to the ground and cover your face with your hands.

ROLL over and over to put out the flames.



Practice your **STOP, DROP and ROLL** before bonfire night. Get your friends to try it too!



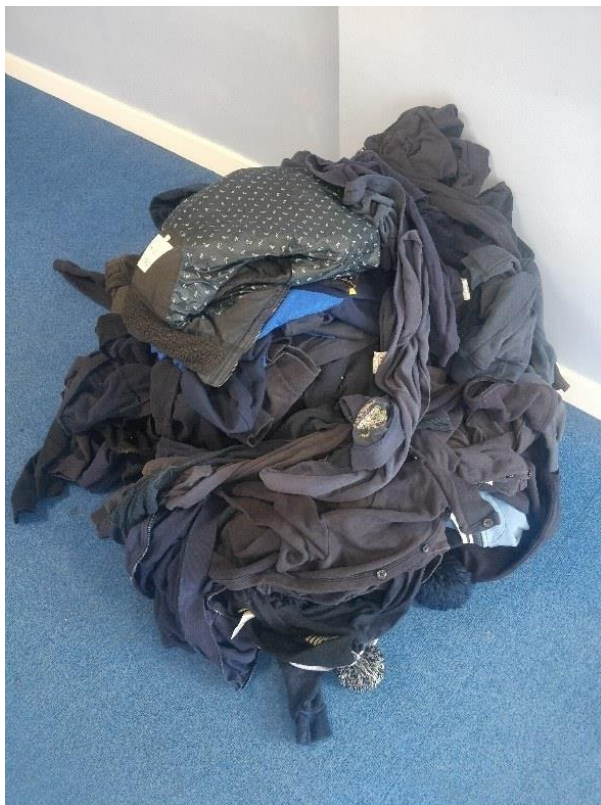
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Lost Property

Swan Stars

If your child will not be attending a scheduled Swan Stars session, we would be grateful if you could inform school in advance. This avoids any confusion at the end of the day and helps us to accommodate children who are on a waiting list for sessions with limited availability.

Church Lane Top Tips for Keeping Children Safe on YouTube

1. Supervised Experience

A supervised experience YouTube account is available with a Google account managed by Family Link. This can help manage how they use the app. It will give you access to content settings and parental controls to help you manage what channels they can subscribe to and how long they spend on the app. Using YouTube Kids is a separate app that offers additional parental controls but they are not 100% effective! So what else can we do?

2. Switch off Auto-play

This will stop videos from automatically playing after one has ended. This will stop your child watching videos suggested by the app. To turn this on, go to the watch screen on any video. Then tap the auto-play switch so it says 'Off'

3. Use Restricted Mode

This will help to filter out inappropriate videos. However, it's still not 100% effective so supervise your child whilst they're online, especially livestream videos. Children can also read inappropriate language in the comments section too!

Should I keep my child off school?



Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over

KS2 Swimming

Our pop-up swimming pool will be installed on the school grounds (KS1 playground) during November. The pool will be on site during November, offering students daily swimming lessons aimed at teaching vital water safety skills and improving swimming proficiency.

The primary focus of these lessons will be on our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils. Each child in these year groups will receive a timetable, outlining when they will be swimming and on which days. During the lessons, the children will work towards demonstrating the ability to swim confidently, competently, and proficiently over a distance of 25 metres, as well as perform safe self-rescue in water-based situations. In the final week, we hope to allocate time for other students to access the pool and benefit from this unique opportunity as well. If this is something we are able to offer, we will be in touch to request consent closer to the time.

Swimming is part of the national curriculum, and the school is pleased to provide this valuable resource for all students. However, we would greatly appreciate voluntary contributions from parents to help cover the costs. If you wish to contribute, you can do so through Arbor when giving consent for your child's participation. Arbor is now open for year 5 and year 6 consent and will close on Monday 4th November so that the timetables can be arranged in advance of lessons commencing.

Please note that to use the pool, children must wear a swim cap. These will be available for purchase from the school closer to the time if your child does not already have a cap.

Sports Hall Athletics

Please be aware that the date for this event has been changed to Thursday 28th November. The team selection has been made from 8 weeks of Sports Hall Athletics PE Lessons. The children have worked hard, strived to improve and had fun along the way.

In preparation for the event, there will be some after-school practice sessions on 6th, 13th and 20th November. Further details of these have been emailed to the parents of relevant pupils. Consent should be confirmed via *Clubs* on Arbor.

Absences

If your child is going to be absent due to a medical appointment, please inform the school office and show confirmation of the appointment (This can be by letter, text, appointment card or email).

If your child is going to be absent due to illness, please inform the school office and give as much detail as possible regarding their symptoms/diagnosis for their attendance records.

If your child is going to be absent for any other reason (e.g. holiday, wedding, non-medical appointment), please complete a Leave of Absence Request Form at your earliest possible opportunity and attach any relevant supporting information that you wish to be taken into consideration. You should be aware that if your child is taken out of school and the reasons are not classed as exceptional, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. **Any appeal should be made prior to the end of the period of absence before an FPN is issued.**

The law requires all children between the ages of 5 and 16 to be in full time education. Under Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 it is the duty of the parent/carer of a child of compulsory school age to ensure that they attend school regularly.

A new National Framework for Penalty Notices came into force on 19th August 2024. As a result of these changes, absences will be tracked over a rolling 3 year period and penalty notices will be issued for the following:

- Term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days
- 10 sessions of unauthorised leave in a rolling 10 week period

Please note that penalty notices may also be issued before the threshold is met where it appears parents are deliberately avoiding the national threshold by taking several term time holidays of less than 5 days.

Penalty notices will continue to be issued per parent per child as follows:

- First Offence – For term time leave or irregular school attendance; Charged at £160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days, reducing to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.
- Second Offence – Where a second notice is issued within 3 years of the first penalty notice for either term time leave or irregular attendance, this will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days.
- Third Offence – If a third offence occurs within 3 years of the first penalty notice, a penalty notice will not be issued but the case may proceed to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'Failure to send a child to school', the Magistrate can impose a fine up to £1000 or legal proceedings under Section 444 (1a) can include a fine of up to £2500.

Please be aware that these changes are national changes and all penalty notices will be issued by Cheshire East Council. The school does not benefit financially in any way from any fines issued.
