For clubs you actually want	Pupils suggested a wide range of clubs; teachers used polls to shape provision.
To improve Celebration Assemblies	Ideas gathered to streamline assemblies (e.g. sharing achievements across the week).
For ideas for Anti-Bullying Week	Pupil-led plans included odd socks day, themed events and collaborative activities.
To promote kindness in school	Suggestions included kindness days, clubs, assemblies, posters and friendship benches.
For concerns about bullying to be taken seriously	The issue was discussed and became a focus for whole-school awareness and action.
To bring back favourite school meals	Chicken curry and all-day breakfast returned to the menu.
For a way to share worries	"I wish my teacher knew..." boxes introduced in every class.
For more pupil support roles	Year 5 Playground Leaders and expanded buddy systems introduced.
For a girls' football club	A dedicated club launched and continues weekly.
For improvements to the school environment	Requests (bins, quiet areas, field improvements) shared with leadership.
To understand British Values better	Assembly recaps introduced and displays updated.

To learn more about children's rights	Rights displays added to classrooms; staff created Duty Bearer posters.
To have your learning preferences heard	Feedback gathered on favourite subjects and how to improve them.
To improve reading across school	Ideas introduced such as reading competitions, monitors and book recommendations.
To boost Accelerated Reader engagement	Plans made for competitions, rewards and increased motivation.
To feel a stronger sense of belonging	Whole-school focus introduced exploring belonging in depth.
To make school more inclusive	Ideas included diverse displays, themed cultural weeks and pupil-led artwork.
To celebrate individuality	Events like Blue for Belonging, potential Colour Run Festival and talent shows promoted.
For more opportunities to share talents	Continued events such as Wistaston's Got Talent, sports competitions and Trust events.
For staff to help children feel more included	Ideas shared such as greetings at the door, staff joining in play and giving daily compliments.
For more opportunities to connect across year groups	Suggestions included whole-school playtimes and shared activities.
For more leadership opportunities	Pupils proposed roles such as buddies, Mental Health Champions expansion and leadership roles.
For a stronger sense of identity and representation	Feedback linked to RE, No Outsiders, PSHE and diverse texts to reflect all pupils.
