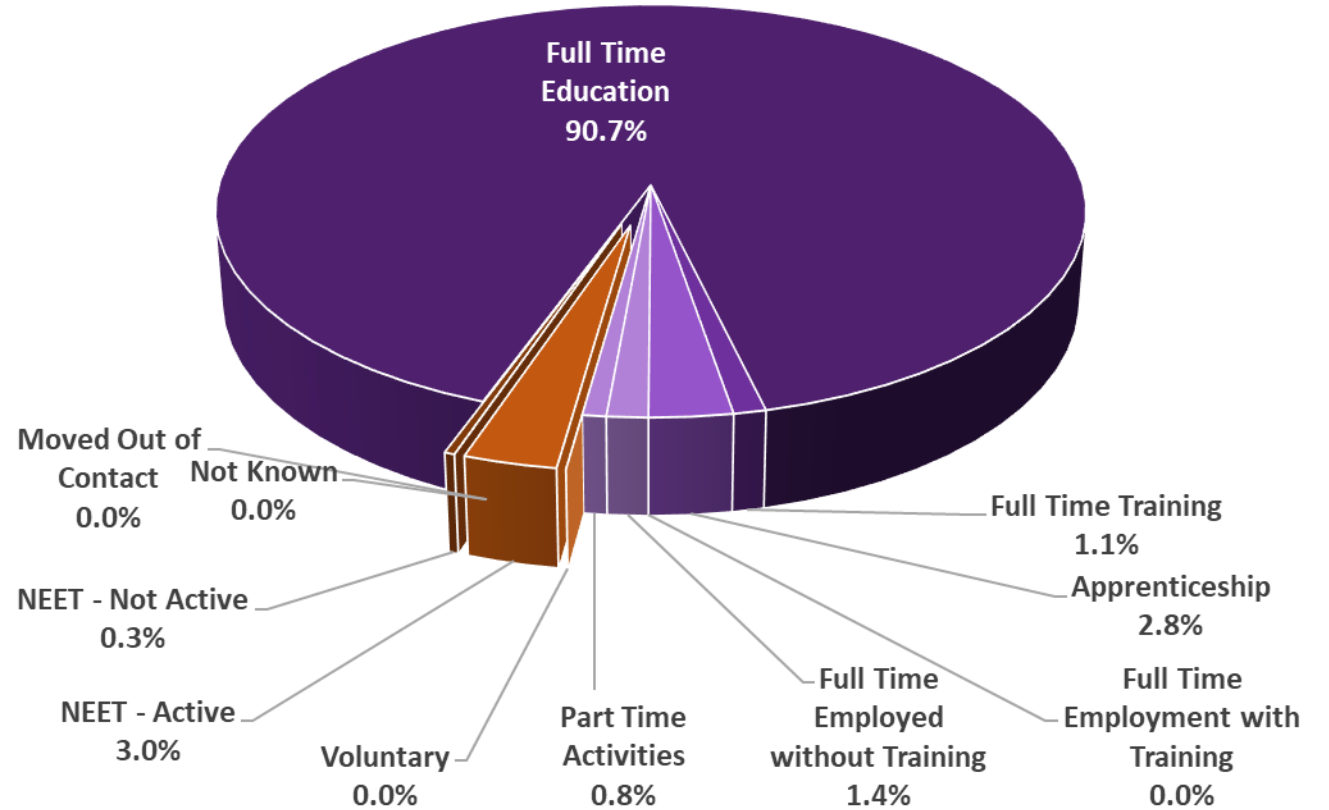
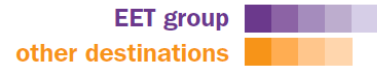

2 Destination Summary

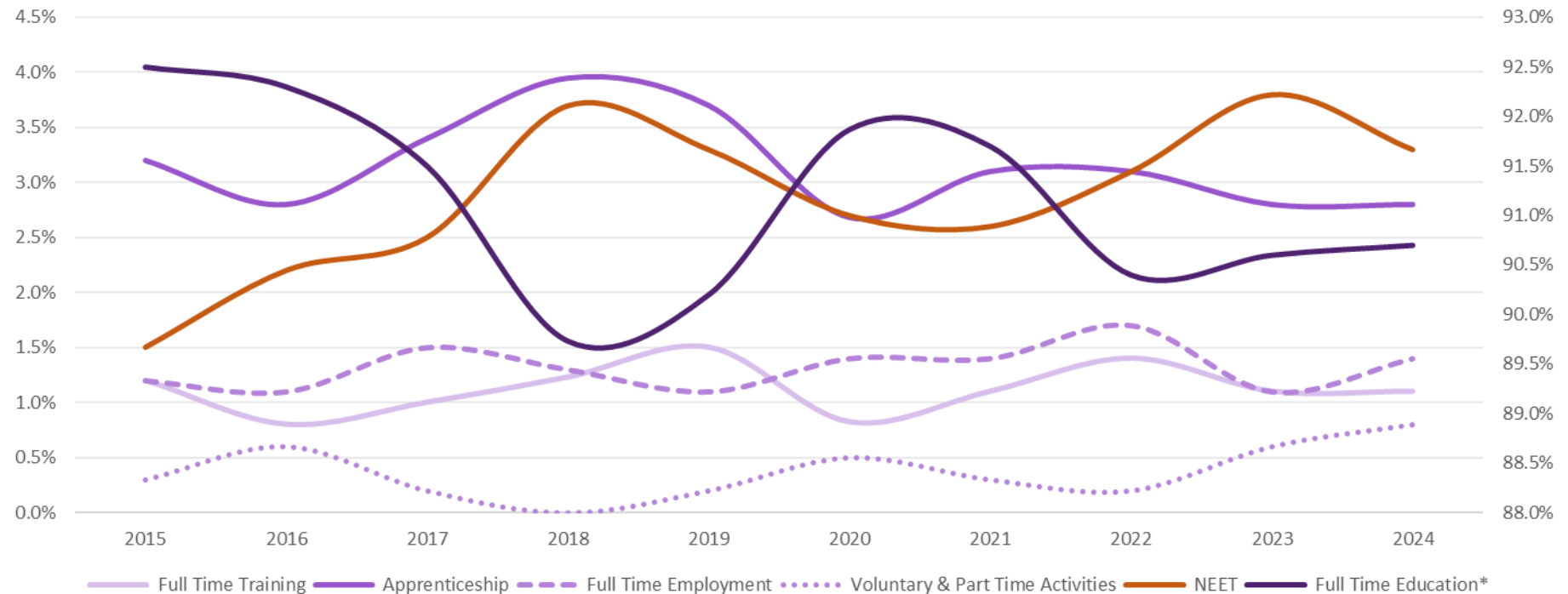


- 96.7% of young people in Bury entered education, employment and training (EET) in 2024. This is a slight increase from 96.1 % recorded in Bury in 2023.
- The proportion of young people in Bury progressing into full time education slightly increased from 90.6 % in 2023 to 90.7% in 2024.
- The proportion of young people in full time training, full time employment with training and apprenticeships decreased from 3.9% in 2023 to 3.8% in 2024.
- The proportion of young people in apprenticeships has maintained at 2.8%.
- The proportion of young people in Bury who were unemployed (NEET) at the time of the survey dropped from 3.9% in 2023 to 3.3% in 2024.
- The Connexions team managed to contact all young people in the cohort, achieving 0% Not Known's.

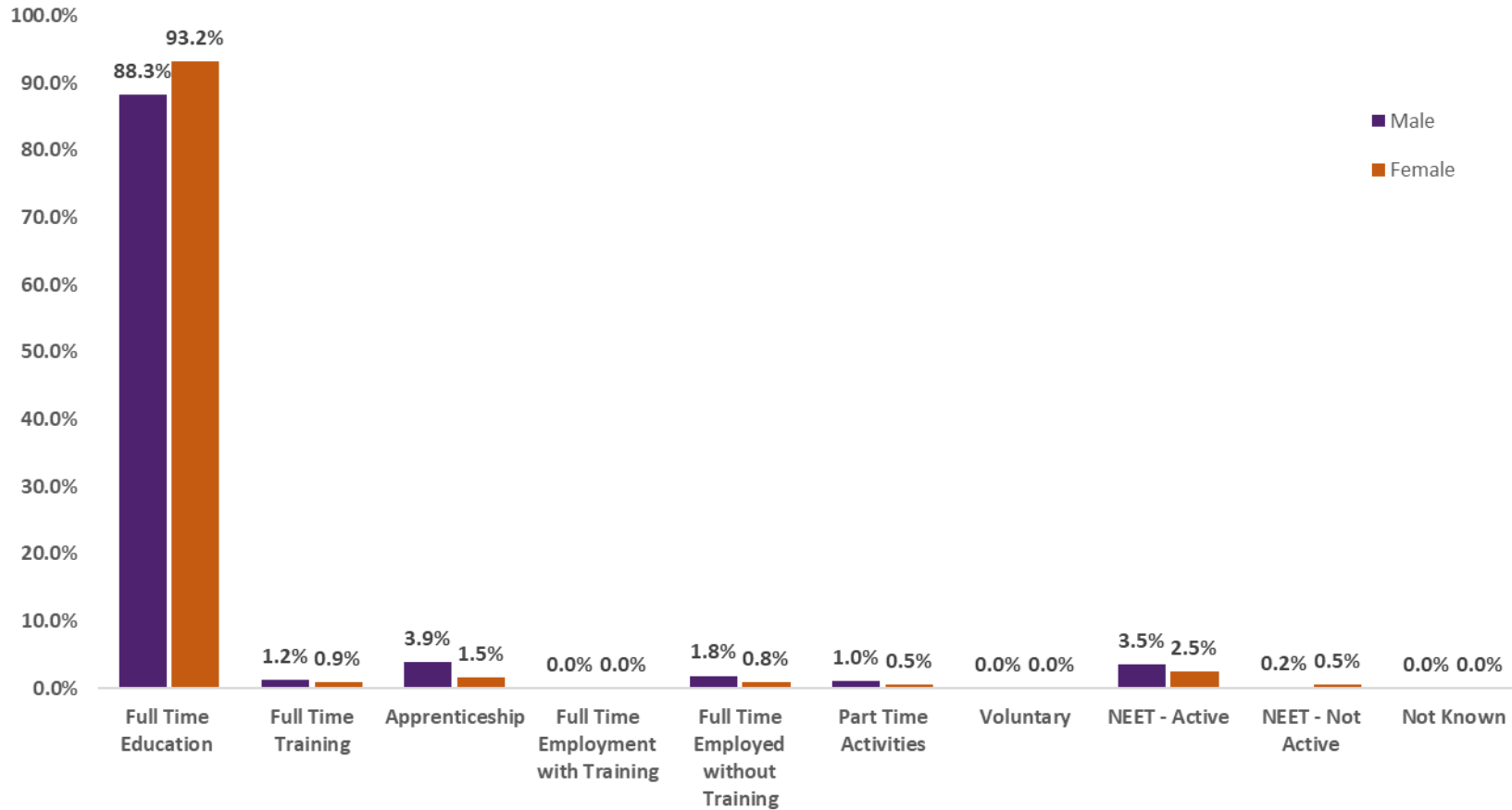

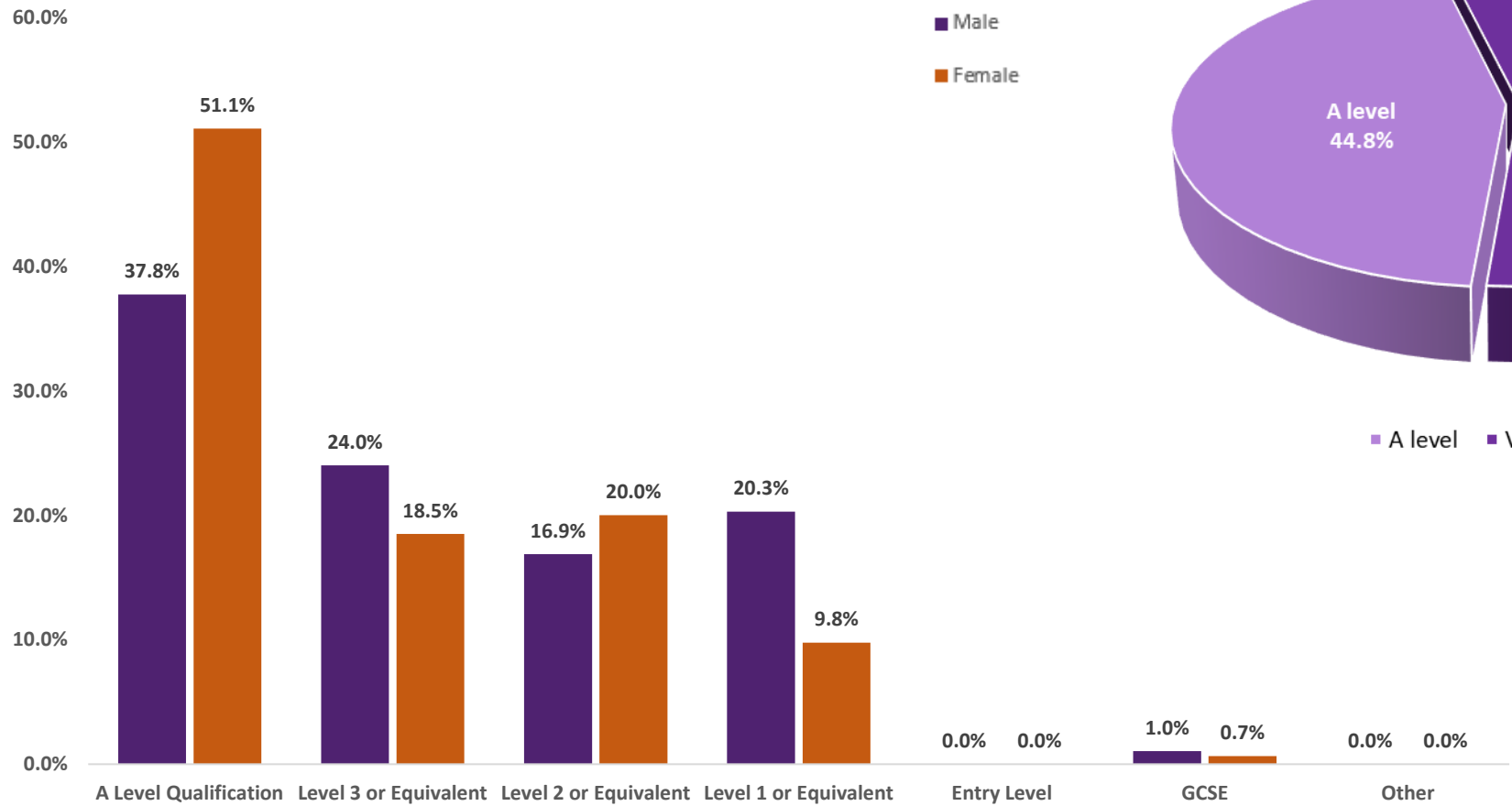
Destination Comparison By Sex



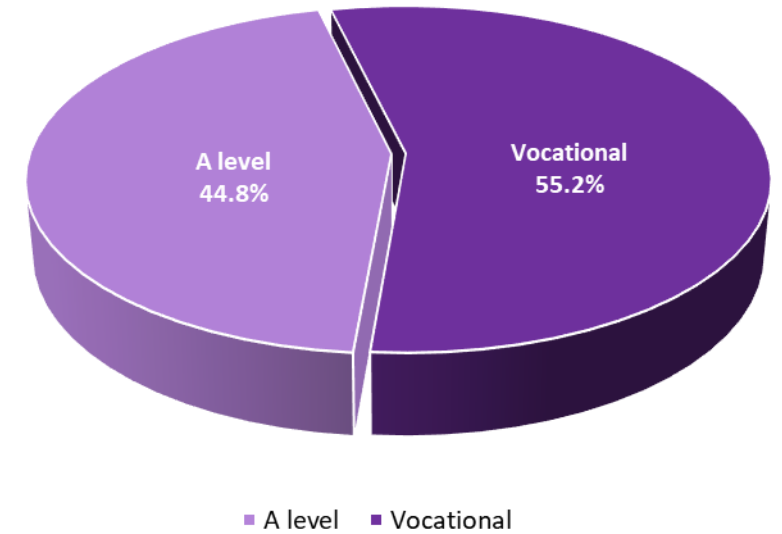
- The proportion of females in full time education remains higher than males, with the 2.8% gap in 2023 increasing to 4.9% in 2024.
- The proportion of females in an apprenticeship has decreased since 2023, with a drop of 0.4% . Males have increased within the same time by 0.3%
- Unemployment (NEET) has reduced by 0.3% for males and 0.7% for females since 2023.

Qualification Comparison By Sex

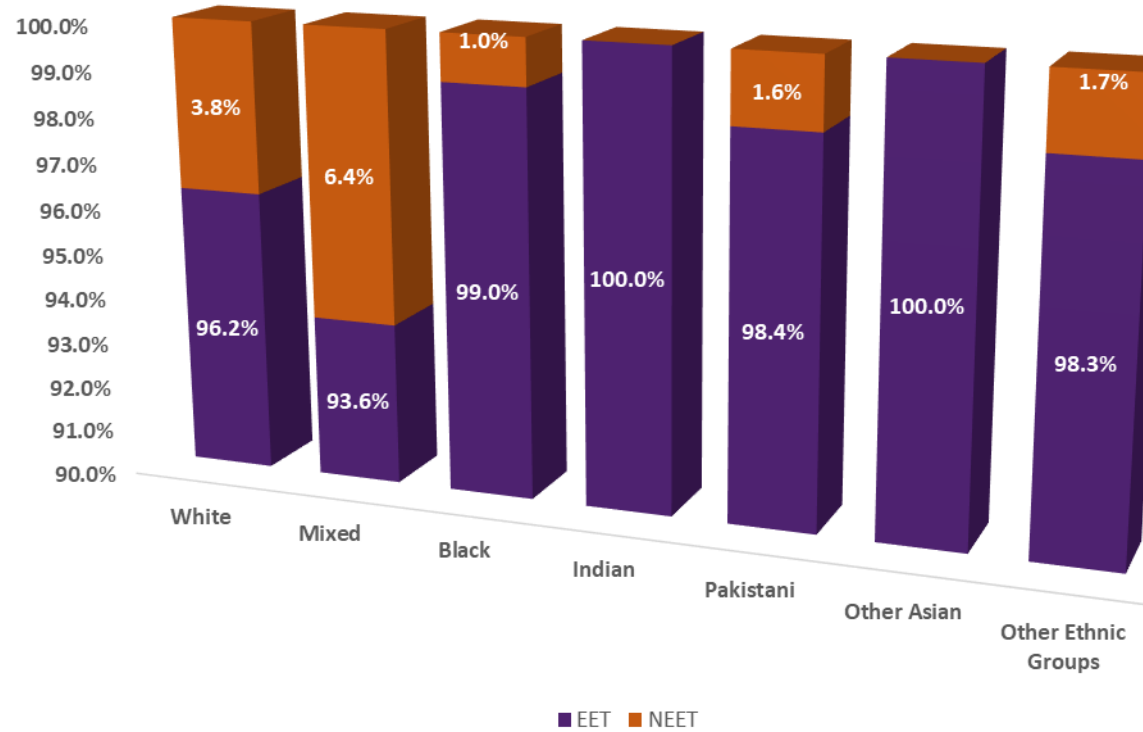


Total Qualification Split

EET/NEET Comparison By Ethnicity

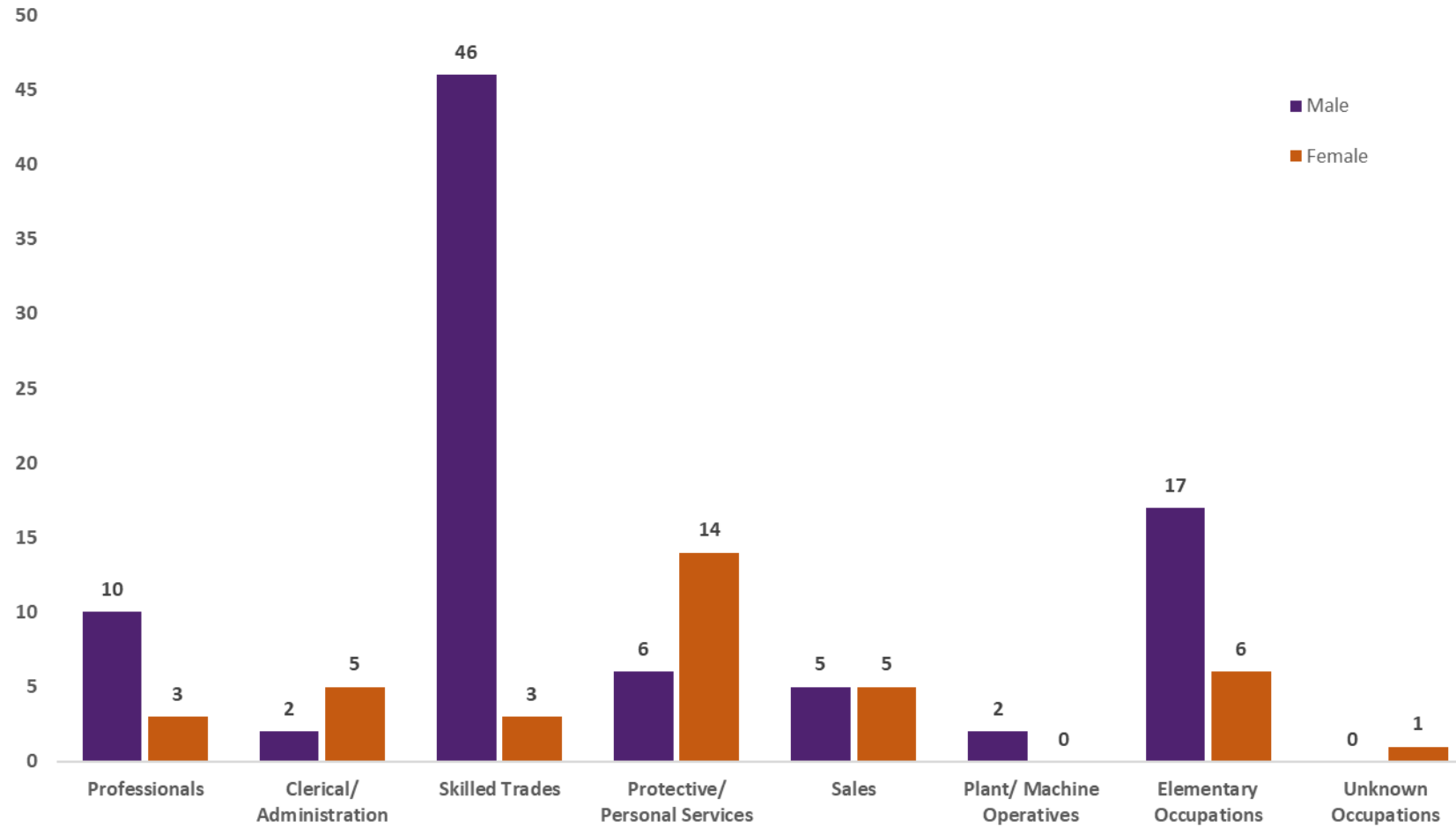

Apprenticeship

Education and Skills Funding Agency funded Apprenticeship

EET (Education, Employment, Training)

The EET percentage is calculated by deducting those Moved out of Contact from the overall survey total. EET includes *Full-Time Education, Full-Time Training, Apprenticeships, Full-Time Employment with Training, Full-Time Employment without Training and Voluntary and Part-Time Activities*.

Full Time Education

Full Time Education includes sixth forms and colleges of further education.

Full Time Training

Government supported training without employed status including Traineeships, Study Programmes and Supported Internships.

FT Employment with Training

Includes full-time employment where formal training is provided but is not an Apprenticeship.

FT Employment without Training

Includes full-time employment where no formal training is provided.

Moved Out of Contact

Known to have moved address but cannot be contacted.

NEET

Not in education, employment or training. Where listed, is the NEET – Active and NEET – Not Active combined figure.

NEET - Active

Young people who are available to the labour market who are not in full-time education, training or employment.

NEET – Not Active

Includes young people who are not in EET for reasons including family care, long-term illness, pregnancy, custodial sentence or seeking asylum.

No Response

Includes young people who could not be contacted or did not wish to participate in the survey.

Voluntary and Part Time Activities

Includes young people who are involved in part time education or employment, re-engagement activities or who are working not for reward.
