

Making Sense of Your Results

GCSEs (General Certificate of Secondary Education)

- Pass Grade: 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1, with 1 being the lowest grade and 9 being the highest grade.
- . U Grade: unclassified/ungraded, means that the student has not achieved enough marks to gain a pass.
- X Grade: means that the student missed parts of the examination and does not pass.
