## The Almighty Dollar

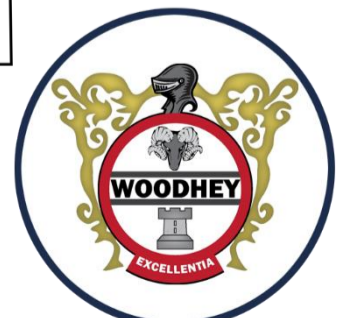
We finish Y7 by following a dollar around the world and seeing how the economy differs in many countries.
