
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Our School Houses and House point total for this week.





Attendance

As you are aware, we have set anattendance target of 96% and are currently at 95.3%. Thank you to parents and carers, for understanding and recognising the need to have high expectations for your children's attendance.

Absence due to illness and medical appointments

Adhering to the attendance policy, which is on the school's website we will mark absence due to physical or mental illness as authorised unless the school has a genuine concern about the authenticity of the illness. Wherethe absence is longer than 5 days or there are doubts about the authenticity of the illness, the school will ask for medical evidence, such as a doctor's note, prescription, appointment card or other appropriate form of evidence. We will not ask for medical evidence unnecessarily. If the school is not satisfied about the authenticity of the illness, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised and parents/carers will be notified of this in advance. Attending a medical or dental appointment will be counted a authorised as long as the pupil's parent/carer notifies the school in advance of the appointment.

However, we encourage parents/carers to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible. Where this is not possible, the pupil should be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary.

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






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












Young Voices offers a unique opportunity for children to explore and express their spirituality in an engaging, joyful environment.
