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




### Young Voices 2024!

### Monday 5th—9th February 2024

As a school, we aim to ensure all children feel safe, happy and ready to learn. We prioritise nurture through our family feel and teaching approaches to support all children.

We're shouting out loud this year for Children's Mental Health Week as the theme is 'My Voice Matters'. We will be teaching the children about the importance of speaking out for help, empowering them with the tools they need to express themselves, their emotions, their thoughts and feelings.

On Monday we have a whole-school assembly about this mental health and how to keep our minds healthy.

On Tuesday, we will be exploring how to keep safe online for Safer Internet Day and how to speak out when we see something that makes us feel uncomfortable. Throughout the week, we will be taking part in daily mindfulness and emotion activities.

And on Friday we will finish with our 'Love Yourself' day, organised by FOWS where children are free to express themselves and who they are.

With Safer Internet Day 2024 coming up (Tuesday 6th February) and with the growing number of children using online devices, I felt it necessary to add this section to the Newsletter. We are also hearing of an increasing number of 'issues' regarding mobile devices i.e. name calling, unkind messages, unkind videos being posted etc. Along with children accessing sites that are not age appropriate. Please remember that if your child has access to a mobile device to monitor their usage and also what sites they are accessing. There is a wealth of information available to parents with detailed guidance on what apps are suitable for different aged children, how to monitor and how to use parent controls to limit access to unsuitable sites. 
