Football match



The children were fascinated in creating a complete circuit. We have also been looking at the Shakespeare play Macbeth, focusing on characterisation. The children have used wonderous vocabulary to describe the witches and enjoyed acting in character! They have also explored rhythm of iambic pentameter. Excellent hard work guys!
