Help us, Lord, to never forget the sacrifices made, and to honour them by being peacemakers in our own lives. May we always remember that we are called to love one another, as You have loved us.



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
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

We absolutely loved watching the diggers and dumper trucks as they worked on the school playground on Thursday 27th October!



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
