OAK CLASS

In Oak Class this week we have been reading 'The Zoo Vet', a story about a VERY busy vet who has to treat lots of different poorly animals. The zoo vet's patients include George a giraffe who has a sore throat, a flamingo called Fatima who has a badly broken wing, and Tori a tiger who has a huge thorn stuck in her paw. Thankfully the vet is able to make all of his patients better, but then.....he wakes up on Saturday morning covered in lots of spots!!!

As a follow-up to the story the children have been sequencing the story using pictures, working out zoo animal riddles, and designing their own safari parks. We also have a Zoo Vet's Clinic role play area where 'fully-trained' (!) vets are on call to treat any poorly or injured zoo animals that are brought in. Oak children are now very proficient in diagnosing a wide range of medical conditions, giving injections, and using expert bandaging techniques, following on from a very thorough initial health check!

In our outside classroom we now have a 'Dinosaur Park' where intrepid adventurers can go on a dinosaur hunt, searching for lots of different dinosaurs in the undergrowth armed with a dinosaur checklist....it would appear that the Pterodactyl is proving to be very elusive!!!
