will	(won't)
would	(wouldn't or would not)
can	(can't or cannot)
could	(couldn't or could not)
may	(may not)
might	(might not)
shall	(shan't or shall not)
should	(shouldn't or should not)
must	(mustn't or must not)
ought	(ought not)
