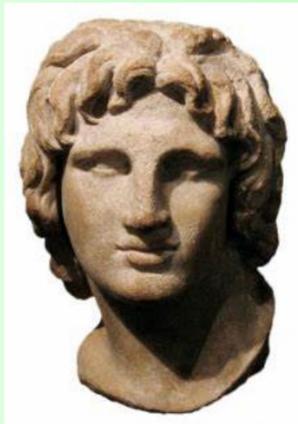

Alexander was born in Pella, in the North of Greece. His father, King of Macedonia, had already conquered Athens.

355 BC

336 BC Alexander becomes king at the age of 20. He quickly conquers all of Ancient Greece, and raises a great army.

What influence did Alexander The Great have on us today?

- He founded many cities- not just because he liked them but strategically (they had excellent trade routes and were in good locations to defend).
- His cities had high populations and were modernized for the era. Some of the founding cities are still around today.
- He spread Hellenisation (Greek language, culture and population) across his known world. This led to the Hellenistic period (continued for 200-300 years after his death). If this hadn't have happened, the world would be very different today.
