



This is what a good diary entry looks like. This has also been attached to the ParentMail.



It should...

- obe written in the past tense,
- obe written in the first person (I, we, my etc.),
- describe the writer's point of view and emotions,
- o include opinions, as well as facts,
- obe written in an **informal style**,
- ouse time conjunctions to link events,
- organise events into pargraphs.
