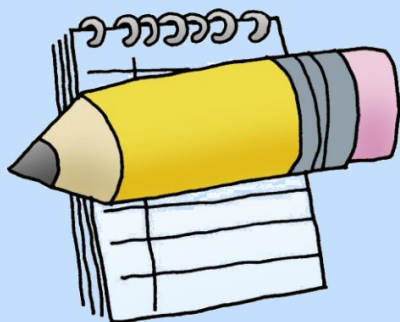

in the sunshine.

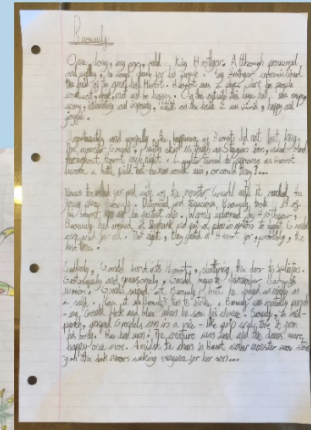
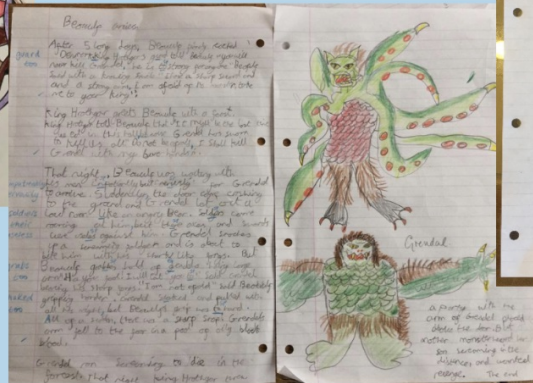
I became a shining stream,

Pre-Teach Words



Arthur (n) - an Icelandic boy, who is the main character of Arthur and the Golden Rope

voyage (n/v) - an adventure

non-chronological (a) - a sequence with no clear order, opposite to chronological

meddler (n) - a person that becomes involved in other people's business, usually when it is not wanted

SPAG Review - Speech

Inverted commas (or speech marks) are placed around direct speech to indicate the words that are being spoken.

"Inverted Commas"
also called speech marks

Inverted Commas go either side of what is actually spoken

"You've left your pen." called James to his friend.
"Thank you," Paul replied, "good job you spotted it, I'd have been looking for that later!"

REMEMBER:
Start a new line for each new speaker,
try and use more interesting words than said!
