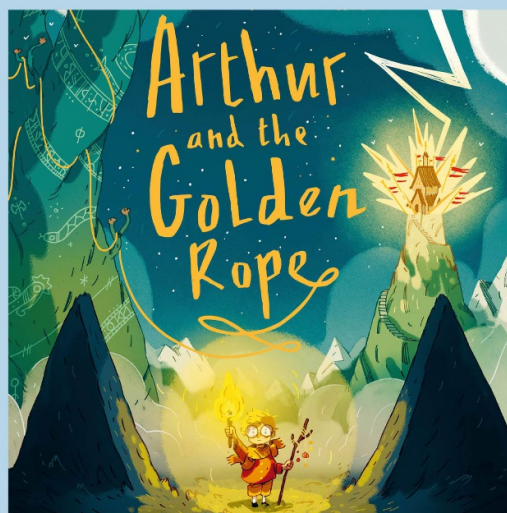

As soon as he was old enough to explore the forest, he showed a great interest in the strange creatures that lived there.



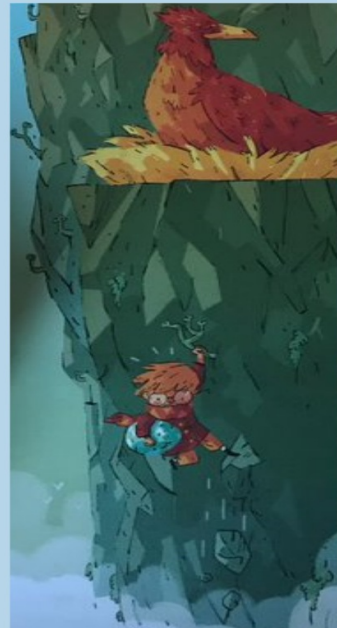
