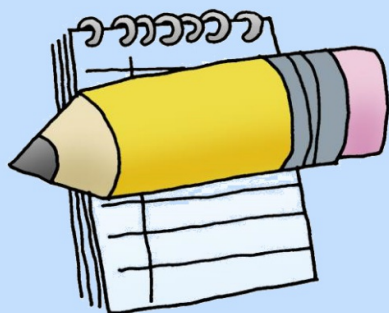


Poem of the Week!
