Shortly before WW2 started, children were sent away to the countryside to be shielded from the war. That was called evacuation. Not all children left, some parents chose not to send their kids. They would be sent on a train, and had a tag in case they got lost. The children would take a gas mask which was essential - and if they were wealthy enough, bring clothes.

The Blitz

The Blitz was a period of time during the war when Germany was bombing England. They were bombing to try make Britain surrender. Many people died in the UK. ~~Citizens~~ Bombings happened at night so citizens went to the Underground. The underground was where people would go at night in case their homes got bombed. Unfortunately, not everyone could get in. In that case, they would go to the Anderson shelter, which is a little shelter in people's backyards.

Concentration Camp

The first Concentration Camp was established in Dachau - March 22nd 1933 - for political prisoners. The purpose during the 1930's was to imprison and intimidate leaders of political, social and cultural movements. When Hitler (leader of Germany during WW2) came into power he used the camps to torture Jewish people, as he blamed them for many things. The most famous camp was ~~was~~ Auschwitz. At least 11 million people died there. Most were killed in gas chambers.

Winston Churchill

Winston Churchill was born on 30th November 1874. He joined the royal Cavalry in 1895. Churchill was elected MP for Oldham in 1900. Winston Churchill was chosen for as prime minister after Neville Chamberlain's resignation in 1940. He led Britain to victory in World War 2. Unfortunately, he died on 24th January 1965.

TREATY OF VERSAILLES

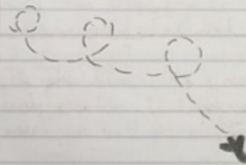
The Treaty of Versailles are a set of rules that most of the countries involved in WW1 agreed to, people believe that is a reason WW2 started. The treaty held Germany responsible for starting and imposed penalties (losing land). Germany had secret meetings about it.

Winston Churchill

Winston Churchill was an amazing man, who made a huge impact on WW2 and led us all to victory. He lived until he was 90 (1874-1965) and in his time he became Prime Minister in 1940 until 1945 and became it the second time in 1951 until 1955. He even won the Nobel Prize in 1953. Although he was Prime Minister, he was also famous for his inspiring speeches that helped Britain.



Concentration Camps

Concentration Camps were a form of torture for the people against Hitler, people that Hitler didn't like and Jews. All together, there was about 44,000 camps and they were all used from 1933-1945. Some people managed to get out alive; others weren't as lucky.

The Blitz

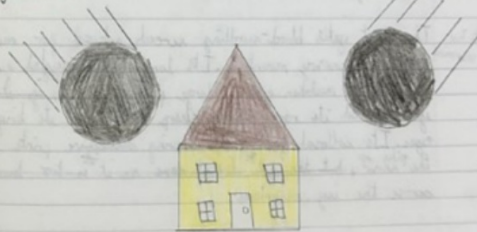
The Blitz was a mass series of bombings caused by the Nazis. Air Raid Sirens were used to warn people; the Germans could be seen coming. On the 7th September 1940, the crisis started and it eventually ended in May 1941. By the end of it, around 1/3 of London was completely ruined.

Evacuation

In 1939, millions of kids, pregnant people and disabled people were evacuated - sent away to the countryside to stay safe. On total, there were about 3 million people evacuated. They couldn't take everything they wanted though, mostly they took clothes and a couple of other things.

Women - What was their role?

Women had an immense role to play in the war; they made weapons, drove fire engines, trains and many more important things. There were about 640,000 women working in armed forces, 55,000 using guns and 80,000 in a land army, Women's Land Army. All together, the Women's Land Army only earned £1.85 a week but they worked 50 hours! The Women's Land Army started in June 1939, and they carried on for years.

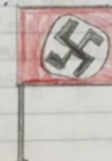
The ballistic Blitz
