

EXERCISE 1: TRUST BINGO:

Get the young people to draw a table of nine squares in a 1x3 grid.

Then they will choose nine sources from the list on page 2 and place one in each square.

Example table:

<i>The President of the United States</i>	<i>Head teacher</i>	<i>Zoella</i>
<i>Cristiano Ronaldo</i>	<i>Prime Minister</i>	<i>Instagram</i>
<i>BBC News</i>	<i>Twitter</i>	<i>Wikipedia</i>

You should then randomly select a different statement from the list on page 3 and read it out. These statements need an independent source to verify them.

If a young person has a name on their card that would be a good source for the statement being read, they should write the number of that statement underneath the name on their card.

Continue to read out statements. When a young person has a statement attached to all their sources, they should shout "BINGO!"

This could be expanded by shouting "LINE!" if a student has three in a row.

The teacher then runs through each of the sources and statements to see if everyone agrees.
