Session 7

How is an egg shell like your teeth?

- 1. Place an egg in a glass or jar filled with cola, taking note of its colour.
- 2. Leave the egg for 30 60 minutes.
- 3. Remove the egg and notice the brown colour which covers the egg.

4. Use a toothbrush and toothpaste to brush the egg back to its original colour. Explanation: Sugar (in the cola) combines with bacteria in your mouth to form acid. This acid, along with the extra acid (in the cola as well), at tacks the teeth. Over time, these acid attacks weaken tooth enamel, the hard outer covering of your teeth, causing discolouration of your teeth as well as holes in your teeth (cavities). The fluoride treatment (your toothpaste) protects the egg's shell from the acid. Your teeth need to be protected from the acids in your mouth with fluoride too – discuss the importance of brushing our teeth and how we do this correctly

Create a poster about a nocturnal animal.



Session 3 - Looking after Pets What do you need to do to look after pets? Who helps to look after pets? What is a vet? What do they do? Work through the 'All about the Vets' ppt focusing on the roles of the people who work in the Vets as well as the different areas such as the waiting room, operating theatre ... Role Play in the Vets
