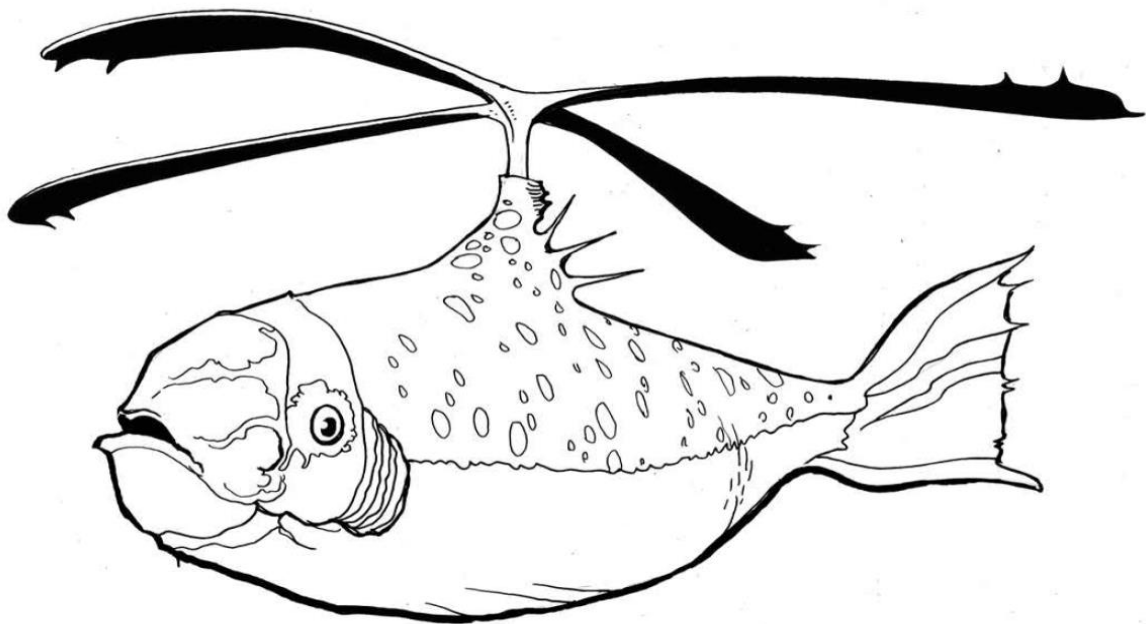

For those of you who are struggling with the Growth Mindset Challenge, all you have to do is write a short paragraph which includes all the words. Try to remember how to spell them as you write, without checking.

EXAMPLE

I worked with a **different group** of children in school today. I had great fun. Also, I do **believe** I remember Mum **mention** that we are having baked **potatoes** for tea tonight as a **surprise** for my Dad. He loves them.



How many words can you add to the table?

- The endings *-cher*, *-ture* and *-sure* all have the similar *-ure* sound:

The *t* sound can be heard in *-ture* words: *picture*, *adventure*

The *sh* sound can be heard in *-sure* words: *treasure*, *measure*.

-cher forms from words ending in *ch*: *teacher*, *butcher*

- These words are generally nouns.

-cher ending	-ture ending	-sure ending
Teacher Butcher	Picture Adventure	Treasure Measure
