Last year I was able to send out a comprehensive bulletin around the **structures of the day from September**, in June – because we have to be ready to respond to any changes from the government unfortunately this is not possible yet – I am as disquieted as you are by this as there is nothing I can do at the moment and trying to 'second guess' at this point I feel is not helpful – I promise that I will be in touch with you as soon as decisions are made nationally.

School reports will be sent out this week – please look out for them on parent mail. Again, they have a different feeling to what you may have typically received historically but do reflect the type of year it has been in education. We will be holding **sports day**/mini-Olympics events over the coming weeks (weather permitting) which we will tweet about – I know this is not the same as attending, which I know lots of you would want to; but may give you a flavour of the events.

We will be holding a **picnic** for the children at the end of term to recognise how brilliant they are and have been during these challenging times – so fingers crossed for great weather – to make it extra special, even through bubbles will prevail, children can wear their 'garden party' clothes, hats etc. – more details to follow. We will endeavour to create a sense of Team Yarm even if it is from a distance.

There are lots of changes planned through the Trust for the new academic year – there will be a new **catering** contract in place (from September), using a newly developed Trust based service AND the introduction of a new information system (in October)– **Bromcom** – which is designed to streamline the range of systems we currently use – more details will be with you from the

Trust before the end of term – we see these as real positive changes moving forward.

Congratulations to Erin (Y4) who received a fire fighters award for being part of a litter picking group on the Eston Hills who collected 100 sacks of litter. You are a shining beacon of community spirit Erin and we are very proud of you. We are still 'consuming' a large amount of soap every day, as everyone's days are punctuated by many **hand wash** stops – I am asking once again if you could possibly support us with a small donation of handwash, to take us to the end of the year?
