As you may be aware there are several areas around school where we are having some **arboreal works** done. Whilst most of these may be scheduled during holiday time there are some which are happening over the coming weeks - In order for these to be done safely, we may need to cordon off areas periodically. Please look out for signs/warning tape etc. so that we can ensure your safety. We will of course make sure that during the day the children are kept safe and away from any areas where works are taking place.

Y6 are organising a **toiletries 'Food Bank'** shortly. Please bear this in mind if you are shopping or have any surplus items at home. As in past years we would like to focus to support children who may not have access to basic toiletries including toothbrushes, hairbrushes and sanitary products (for those girls who are impacted by period poverty). Look out for the poster which will come out soon with more details. Many thanks for your support.

Update on the Uganda initiative – as you know the children 'ran to Uganda' last year as part of the Trust charity launch to support **Kingstone school in Uganda** – the great news is that the £3400 raised has been used to:

- Install running water- previously they had to walk each day to get water from the local well
- Install fencing around the school to ensure children were safe
- Put a concrete floor into one of the classrooms and complete the brick walls to prevent pupils getting wet during the daily rain showers
- Secure a room and install electric to ensure the laptops donated by ELT have an electric source and are secured
- Convert a derelict building into a new classroom with a roof, door and windows

Teachers across the Trust are also contributing to the salaries of the teachers at Kingstone. So, what next? Well, the Trust have asked for support from academies to hire a container to send over whatever we can to enhance the experiences of the children at the school. Our School Council have agreed that the £40 needed from us can come from their Christmas Fayre profits; and have contacted regional football clubs to ask for donations (as we have heard that the children love to play football with bare feet and no proper ball). These have started to come into school and we are delighted that we will be able to send something to the container which the children at Kingstone will love. Congratulations to the Y6 group, who are working on this – there are I am sure you agree, many lessons to learn from this work. We will keep you updated.
