**REMINDER -** Please note – changes to the academic year 21/22 Due to an additional bank holiday, which has been granted by the Government in order to celebrate the Queens Platinum Jubilee, the local authority has amended the academic calendar for 2021/2022. The new calendar means that schools will return to school on 2nd September 2021 – which would mean that if we take the planned PDDay that children would be due to return on the Friday – not an ideal situation. Therefore, we have reorganised the scheduled PDDays to allow for children begin on a Monday. The PDDays for next year are therefore:

- 1. Thursday 2nd September 2021
