The Inspector is limited in what he can write (in word count and expression) in an ungraded visit and although not in the report, he may very well have written about the fantastic strength that is reading across our school and that Writing is an emerging area of improvement. Due to the nature of the inspection, not all curriculum areas were able to be showcased, however, I was able to present evidence around the breadth of the curriculum we offer. We are delighted that the personal development and behaviour in school continue to be recognised as of the highest standard.



External accountability will continue to be a regular part of what we do, through our termly Enquiries and regular visits from the central team around all aspects of school life.

Children have continued to access **enrichment** through visitors (authors, vicars and ducklings included!), visits, sporting events, performance, and projects such as Mrs Meeks 'growing schemes across school', Y6 Legacy projects, whole school financial awareness work, Science week etc. and the summer term promises to include even more for our young people to link to their learning.

School closes for Spring break on Thursday 28th March and reopens on Monday 15th April.


