
We had a day of enquiry into **Writing** with colleagues from the Trust – which was a great opportunity to look at some fabulous work across school, from the early mark making in Nursery to some complex *long writes* in upper school. The children were able to speak with confidence about how lessons are sequenced and how they work to meet their targets. Since the Pandemic, we, as is the typical picture across England, have seen the biggest impact on Writing in school. Whilst this continues to be an important areas of development in school, what a lot of great progress is being made – well done everyone!
