A coronation is the ceremony when the King or Queen first get crowned.

There also needs to be special music for the event which is known as the <u>Coronation Anthem</u>

When our Queen Elizabeth II had her coronation in 1953 the music that was played was called "Zadok the Priest" which was written by a composer called George Frideric Handel



This music has been used for coronations since 1727.
