Having completed an **upper school survey** for the school year to date, part of the outcomes were:

In response to the question - Have you ever received a message (chat) that upset you? 44% of the cohort said 'yes'.

In response to the question - Have you ever sent a chat message or posted a comment that you later wished you hadn't? 37% of the cohort said 'yes'. In response to the question – Have you ever seen an image online that has upset you? 28% of the cohort said 'yes'.
