**Keeping Safe**

To protect from harm

**Stranger**

A person who is unfamiliar to you.  
Someone who you don't know.

**Electricity**

The flow of tiny particles called electrons and protons. Electricity is needed to make certain things work.

**Medicine**

A pill or liquid used to prevent, cure or treat an illness.

**Green cross code**

A set of rules to help people cross the road safely.

**Changes**

To make or become different.

**Transition**

A situation of change in which people have to move into a new environment.

**New Beginnings**

To start something new.
