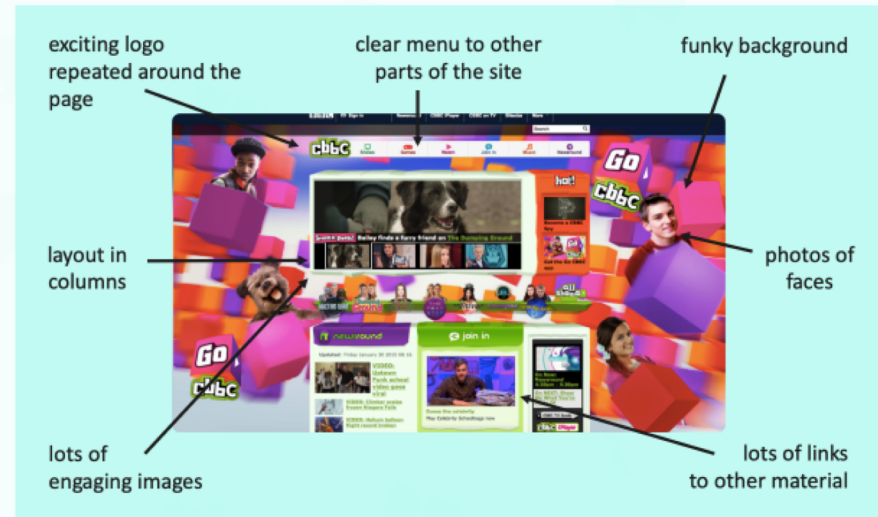

6. Choose a theme for the page, colours and font style.

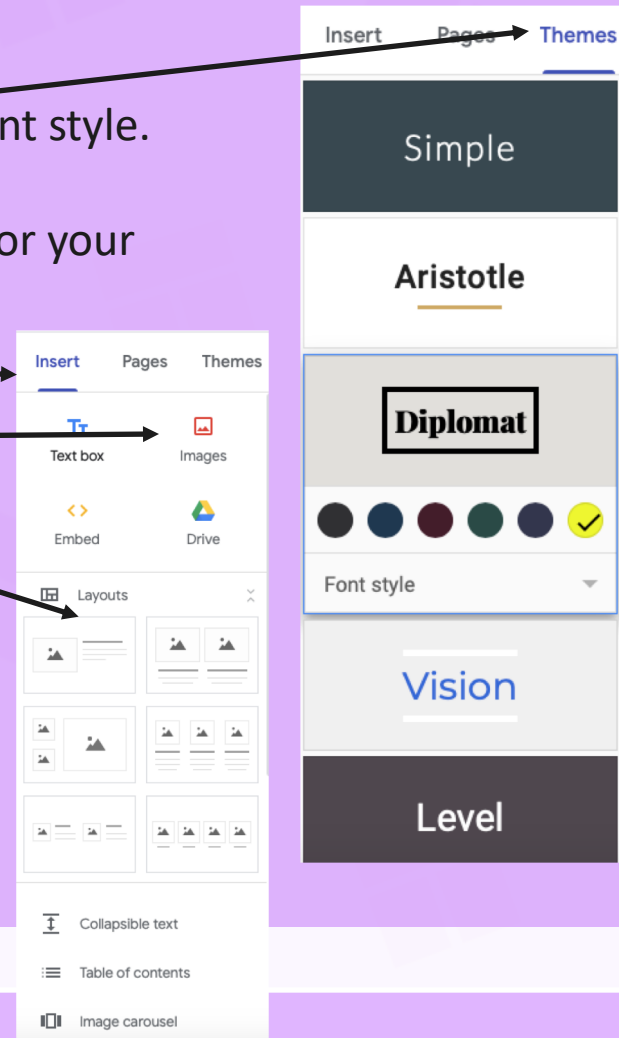
7. Click on the Insert Tab and choose a Layout for your webpage.

Think about which Space facts you can add to your text boxes!



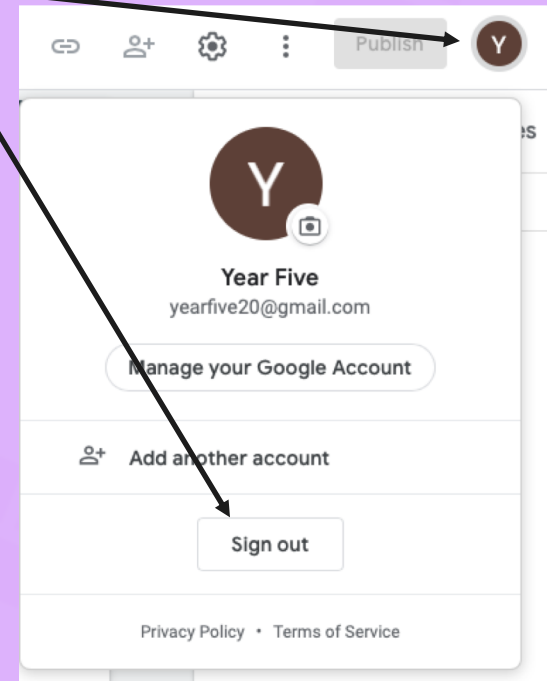
# Signing Out
