WHAT ARE WE LEARNING ABOUT?

COMMUNICATON, LANGUAGE AND LITERACY

We will be using our phonic and keyword knowledge to support with our reading and writing. We will be concentrating on writing sentences using our phonic knowledge to hear and represent sounds. We will also be focussing on spelling some of our keywords accurately. We will continue to focus on the correct use of capital letters and full stops as well as finger spaces. Handwriting will be an area of focus with the children being encouraged to form their letters correctly, on a line and to use consistent sizing. We will be writing in a range of genres including lists, letters and instructions. We will be continuing to focus on speaking and listening skills, in particular the children's understanding of the books that we read. We will be encouraging the children to use their imagination and introduce a storyline into their play within our new role-play areas.

MATHMATICS

In our Number work we will continue to reinforce number recognition, counting in steps of ones, twos and tens and finding 1 more and less. We will be focusing on the children's recall of basic number facts such ad doubles and halves as well as working on using our knowledge of number bonds to 5/10 to support addition and subtraction problems. Shape. Space and measures work will continue to be a focus and we will be naming and describing 2D and 3D shapes as well as comparing objects by length, height and weight.









UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

We will be finding out about lifecycle and habitats of different animals as part of our focus on chicks. We will also be finding out about bees later on in the term.



As part of 'Castles, Fairy tales and Dragons' topic we will be thinking about life in the past and comparing it to now. We will be exploring different types of castles and finding out about their different features. We will also be carrying out a number of experiments linked to our topic work.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

In P.E. this term, we will be focussing on Games. We will be focussing on working as a team, taking turns and cooperation. We will be working on developing both our fine and gross motor movements.

We will be thinking about the different ways to keep healthy and will continue to encourage healthy choices through prime time and lunchtime.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS

We will be using a variety of media to create artwork linked to our topic. We will continue to have weekly music sessions focussing on rhyme and rhythm. We will be learning new songs and using instruments to recreate the different sounds. We will be using the indoor and outdoor areas to

retell and create our own stories.



PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

As part of our 'Relationships' topic we will be encouraging the children to think about their feelings and work together to solve problems. After half term, we will be thinking about 'Changes' as part of the children's transition into Key Stage 1. The children will continue to participate in weekly circle time sessions.
