Structure

Introduction

Grab the reader's attention and clearly state your opinion.

Main Body Paragraphs

Give reasons for your opinions and explain these in detail.

Conclusion

Remind the reader of your opinion and leave them with something to think about.

Shared Writing


- Ocheck your introduction and edit/improve.

Point-Evidence-Explain

Over the last few painful years, which have been more damaging than the last, our land has faced more and more destructive droughts.
